Early Dismissal/Late Arrival

Between 9:30 am and 3:30 pm the campus gates will be closed. To access the campus, approach the entry gate and push the intercom button. Wait for the front office staff to respond. Display your photo Identification and state the purpose of your visit to campus. "Hi I am Ms. Jane Doe and I am here to pick up John Doe for a dentist appointment." The gate will open. Proceed to a parking place. Upon entering the front office building you will need to display your id a second time. The front office staff will then buzz you into the building. Your student will need to sign out before leaving campus.

If you are bringing a student to campus late and the gate is closed, use the same procedure to gain access to the campus. You may drop your student off at the front office. The student will sign in and receive a pass before reporting to class.

Grades

Middle Students earn grades in all middle school classes. Academic credits are earned in each of the four core classes, Language Arts, Science, History, and Math. Students must pass all semesters in all core classes before being promoted to High School. Parents are highly encouraged to monitor their students grades weekly. This is done by logging on to Focus and entering their student's identification number.

Extracurricular Activities

Middle school students will have several opportunities to participate in activities after normal school hours. This includes but is not limited to club meetings, sporting events, dances/socials, Band practice etc. It is essential that all students are picked up from these events in a timely manner. Students picked up late will not be permitted to participate in future after school activities.

Interscholastic Sports

Middle students are invited to try out for one of our sport teams. Charlotte County offers Girls and Boys Basketball, Girls Volleyball, Coed Track and Coed Wrestling. Before trying out for a team, students must turn in all paperwork to our Athletic Director, Coach Tim Gretzler. Details for required paperwork, game schedule and other important information can be found on our School Website, and District Website. You may also call the school if you need additional information. Dates and times for tryouts and practices are set by the coaches and will be communicated by them as the season nears.



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Dress Code

Middle School Dress Code is very different from elementary school. The School Dress Code is set by the State of Florida and by the District and not by individual schools. A complete description of Charlotte County student dress code is published in the Charlotte County Public Schools Student Code of Conduct. The following is a description of some but not all dress code requirements. No undergarments may be seen. This includes but is not limited to boxer shorts, underwear, and bra straps. No skin is to be seen above the knee. This includes shorts, dresses, or pants with holes above the knee. It is acceptable to wear leggings under pants or other clothing. Tape, paper, or pieces of material placed to cover a hole on clothing does not meet dress code. All shirts must cover the shoulder and the midriff completely. Clothing with logos that advertise weapons, drugs, alcohol are not permitted. All profane speech or sexual images are prohibited.

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Technical Educational Opportunities

Murdock Middle School and Charlotte Technical College have partnered to bring technical educational opportunities to interested 8th grade students. Students may apply to the Building Construction Technologies and/or the Public Safety and Security programs. Classes are offered at Charlotte Technical College during the normal school day. Transportation is provided. These are semester long courses, allowing students to apply for both programs. Seats are limited and are offered on a first come first serve basis. If interested please call 255-7525 and ask to speak with our Guidance Office.

School Hours

First period begins every morning at 9:10. The school day ends at 4:10. Any student arriving to campus after 9:10 must report to the front office to obtain a Tardy Pass. Tardy passes are required for both excused and unexcused tardiness.

Arrival

The parent drop off gate will open at 8:00 and close at 9:30 each morning. The pedestrian gates used by students walking or riding their bike to school will open at 8:30 and close at 9:30. Students walking or riding should not arrive before 8:30 as the sidewalk gates will be locked. Campus gates open for students at 8:40. Upon entering campus students will report directly to either their grade level pod, 6th grade to D pod, 7th grade G pod, 8th grade B pod, or to the café for breakfast.

Dismissal

Students are dismissed at 4:10. Any student riding a bus goes directly to the bus ramp. Walkers and bike riders exit campus using the sidewalk gate beside our marquee. Students going to parent pick up proceed directly to the front of the Administrative building.
