Important Policy Information

The School Board has developed a new Student Dress Code for grades 6-12. A full description of the Dress Code can be found in the Student Code of Conduct. Below in bold is the most significant change. In addition, a reminder is highlighted regarding certain symbols, abbreviations, or insignias students may not wear on campus.

"Clothing must have sleeves and cover the body from shoulder to shoulder, one armpit across to the other armpit, and down to approximately mid-thigh. Undergarments must not be viewable. Rips, holes, or tears in clothing must be below mid-thigh. A sleeve is defined as the part of a garment that wholly or partly covers a person's arm."

Last year we experienced an increasing number of violations related to Dress Code Policy # 7. In an effort to avoid confusion and to reduce student discipline Dress Code Policy #7 is highlighted.

7. Gang paraphernalia, garments and/or jewelry, tattoos, or other insignias, which display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related wording/graphics or may tend to provoke violence or disruption in school shall not be worn.

Recently we have experienced an increase in students wearing clothing etc. with a slogan, abbreviation, or symbol that refers to the "F" word. The School Board Policy states, students shall not use oral or written profanity. This includes wearing clothing that directly or indirectly uses vulgarity. Whether a symbol, abbreviation, or slogan. Students wearing any such symbol will be required to change their clothing. Refusing to comply with the requirement to change clothing will result in disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct. - Your students' level of achievement on state or district assessments in reading/ language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

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Transportation

Bus:

Parents, in an attempt for our students to get home in a timely manner, we are incorporating a 4:15 Bell this upcoming year. When the 4:15 Bell rings; students are expected to be on their bus and ready to exit campus. This will afford us the opportunity to clear our campus in a safe and timely manner.

Parent Pick-Up:

Parents, if you pick your child up in the afternoon after school, please be here no later than 4:30 pm. Our staff day is over at 4:20, therefore, supervision is extremely limited, and we want your child to be safe at all times.

Secondly, when we have after-school activities such as sporting events or intramurals please be here to pick your child up when the event is over. We do not have staff present after school hours and again our goal is for your child to be safe at all times.



Where Is My Student's Bus Stop?

The <u>Bus Stop Locator</u> will allow you to find the stops within the school district established walking distances of your home for every school serving students near your residence. Parents should use the <u>Bus Stop Locator</u>. Enter your home address, select the school or schools you want to check, and click on "enter." The stops, bus numbers, and times will be displayed for your home. If no stop is listed, contact the Area Manager for your student's school.

Early Dismissals/Late Arrivals

Between 9:30am and 3:30pm the campus gates will be closed. To access the campus, approach the entry gate and push the intercom button. Wait for the front office staff to respond. Display your photo identification and state the purpose of your visit to campus. "Hi I am here to pick up John Doe for a dentist appointment". The gate will open. Proceed to a parking place. Upon entering the front office building you need to display your ID a second time. The front office staff will then buzz you into the building. Your student will need to sign out before leaving campus.

If you are bringing a student to campus late and the gate is closed, use the same procedure to gain access to the campus. You may drop your student off at the front office. The student will sign in and receive a pass before reporting to class.

Extracurricular Activities

Middle school students will have several opportunities to participate in activities after normal school hours. This includes but is not limited to club meetings, sporting events, dances, socials, band practice and much more. It is essential that all students are picked up from these events in a timely manner. Students picked up late will not be permitted to participate in future after school activities.



Interscholastic Sports

Attention all Mariners interested in trying out for interscholastic sports this upcoming 22-23 school year. You will need the following: Completed Sports Physical (by a licensed physician), Parent Consent Form and Proof of Valid Insurance. These forms can be found on the CCPS website under athletics. You may also pick up a printed copy at the school. All 3 forms MUST be completed and turned in before tryouts begin. Participation in upcoming boys and girls Basketball will begin late August, girls Volleyball – October and Track and Wrestling in March.

You may also call the school if you need additional information. Dates and times for tryouts and practices are set by the coaches and will be communicated by them as the season nears. Don't wait until it's too late, get your paperwork turned into Coach Summers or the front office! Go Mariners!!

All students must maintain a 2.0 GPA in order to participate in interscholastic sports.

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Anti-Bullying Policy

Charlotte County Public Schools does not tolerate bullying, which includes cyberbullying. Throughout the school year, our schools do a variety of classroom, large group, and small group lessons on bullying and bully prevention.

Though we teach all of our students that bullying is wrong, it still occasionally occurs. And, while we would like cases of bullying to be reported to the administration, they are not always reported.

Parents - if you have a bully (or cyberbullying) concern please let us know. If your child is a target and is being bullied or if you believe your child bullies others, please let us know. Open and consistent communications with the school will not only help your child but will help many others and the school. Unfortunately, some bully situations take a number of interventions before it subsides. Please continue to communicate with the school and provide any additional information that will help the school put an end to the situation.

It is important to note that investigation of cyberbullying can occur regardless of whether the bullying was conducted using public or private property (cell phone, computers, etc). Please reference Florida Statute 1006.47
