Important New District Policy

This year the district is requiring all students to wear a photo ID. This policy has been in effect for the past two years at our high schools and is now required for elementary and middle school students. The wearing of ID badges is becoming common in the work place, college campuses and now in many of our nation's K-12 schools. It is just one more safety measure our district is putting place. In order to access campus during the school day the student must wear their photo ID badge. The district has purchased lanyards and the ID cards. ID badges and lanyards are provided free of charge to the family. Students will be receiving their ID's during the first week of school. The photo is the same as the student photo in Focus. Parents you can support this change by reminding your student to wear their ID every day.

Dress Code

Murdock follows the district's policy on dress code. That policy states that clothing must have sleeves and cover from shoulder to shoulder and down to the middle of the thigh. Proper footwear shall be worn at all times, and there are no hats (or any other headgear), hoods, or sunglasses allowed. Any clothing/jewelry with obscene, vulgar, or otherwise inappropriate symbols or material on them are not allowed. Cellphone Policy

Governor DeSantis signed a law that went into effect July 1, 2023 prohibiting student use of cell phones and other electronic devices in classrooms. The CCPS Student Code of Conduct states "Student use of cellular phones or other electronic devices is strictly prohibited during the instructional time. Cellular phones or other communication devices used during the school day or on the school bus without specific permission will be confiscated." An electronic communication device includes any device capable of receiving or transmitting text, email, voice or image/photo. All Murdock Middle School students are required to turn off and store their cell phone and all other electronic communication devices in their bookbags before coming onto campus in the morning. They are to remain off and stored until the dismissal bell. Electronic communication devices are not to be carried on the student's person including pockets. Any device capable of communicating must be turned off and stored in a purse or bookbag. Any violation of this policy will result in the following:

1st Offense: The device is confiscated and turned into the

front office. Student may pick up the device at the end of the school day. Parent is notified.

2nd Offense: The device is confiscated turned into the front

office and will remain at the front desk until it is

picked up by a parent or guardian.

3rd Offense: The student will be required to turn in the

electronic device to the front desk each morning before starting the school day. They will pick up

the device at the end of the day.

A student's refusal to turn in communication device when directed to do so by a staff member or administrator will face additional discipline.



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SPORTS 2023-2024 Middle School Athletics

We offer four interscholastic sports. Students grades six through eight can try out and play for our middle school squads. Before trying out, students must earn and maintain a 2.0 GPA, have a physical, proof of insurance, and liability waiver. In order to play athletes must meet the team behavioral expectations and comply with the Student Code of Conduct.

Despite being the "small" middle school in our District, we are a three-time boys' basketball county champs, three-time girls' track county champs, and our girls' Volleyball Team went undefeated winning a championship. Anti-Bullying Policy

Charlotte County Public Schools does not tolerate bullying, which includes cyberbullying. Throughout the school year, our schools do a variety of classroom, large group, and small group lessons on bullying and bully prevention.

Though we teach all of our students that bullying is wrong, it still occasionally occurs. And, while we would like cases of bullying to be reported to the administration, they are not always reported.

Parents-ifyou have a bully (or cyberbullying) concern please let us know. If your child is a target and is being bullied or if you believe your child bullies others, please let us know. Open and consistent communications with the school will not only help your child but will help many others and the school. Unfortunately, some bully situations take a number of interventions before it subsides. Please continue to communicate with the school and provide any additional information that will help the school put an end to the situation.

It is important to note that investigation of cyberbullying can occur regardless of whether the bullying was conducted using public or private property (cell phone, computers, etc). Please reference Florida Statute 1006.47


