Students can elect to continue the program in 9th grade.

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Winter Media Center News

Although the weather is warm, it's still a great time to cozy up with a good book. Students are welcome to visit the library during the school day to check out books, work on research projects, and enjoy a little quiet reading time. In addition to the school day, the Media Center is open in the morning before 1st period. During this time, students can work on homework, read, check out books, do personal research, and catch up on current events.

We now have ebooks and audiobooks available! Students can access these materials using MMS SORA, which is on Classlink, or by using the SORA app on a smartphone. The SORA app is a free download. We have over 200 titles available and are adding new ones each month.

Our Mariner Reading Challenge is in full swing. The purpose of the challenge is to have students read titles they normally wouldn't choose, such as non-fiction and biography. It is styled like a bingo card. Students can choose which squares to fill using the twenty-five categories. Rows, columns, four corners, and a full card earn rewards. Students have until the beginning of April to complete the challenge.

This year the library has been host to several activities. Selected Language Arts students viewed a live virtual play and were able to speak with the playwright. Art club and Mariner Pride continue to meet after school. Reading students have benefited from the reading environment to choose and read books that help them grow as readers. Credit Recovery students have been making great strides and are on their way to having all the credits they need to continue to the next grade level.

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
