Principal's Message

Mariners, I just finished a review of our 2022-23 academic performance with our new Superintendent of Schools, Mark Vianello. I am pleased to report our students earned their best Florida State Tests scores in a decade. We grew in all three Language Arts and all three Math categories. Our students' scores moved from C's to A's in all Math areas and from a B's to an A's in Social Studies. I just can't say how proud our Mariner Faculty and Staff are of our students. Further, we also experienced a significant decline in disciplinary referrals, and an improvement in attendance. Because of this I want to say a huge thank you and congratulations to our students, their parents and families and every member of our Mariner Staff. While I would love to celebrate a little longer, we are already well into the 2023-24 school year. Like in team sports, those are last year's scores. We are now looking forward to seeing the growth and successes of all our Mariner students in the 2023-24 school year.

To create diverse learning opportunities, we have added a few new exploratory classes. For the first time we are offering an Entrepreneurial and Small Business Industry Certification to some of our 8th grade students. Those students can also earn high school credit along with their industry certification. We also purchased a new coding software "Minecraft" which will extend students computer coding skills and improve their ability to communicate with the robots they

build. In addition to these amazing new opportunities, MMS now offers 3 chorus classes to complement our growing band program. Our Mighty Mariner Band has expanded to include a Pep Band as well. The Pep Band played for the first time at our final home basketball game. Their musical performance added excitement and fun to an already electric atmosphere. It was incredible to see them work so well together after only practicing for a few short weeks. We hope to see our exploratory offerings expanded to help students find a pathway to careers that excite them and provide the potential to earn an excellent living. Clearly, we had a great 2022-23 and we are now continuing to build on that success.

Like all successful organizations, we always look for areas to improve. This year we are focusing on student attendance. The data is clear, students that attend school 95% of the time make better grades and build better friendships. Missing just two days in a month puts the student at risk of falling behind. Two days does not sound like much but at the end of the year that is 18-20 days of school, or equal to missing one month of their education a year. It is the same as missing 1 and ½ years of their K-12 education. Parents, we need your help. Please get your students to school on time every day and keep them on campus for the entire day. We know things happen and students must miss days from time to time. But you can help us be successful by making sure they know you expect them to be in class each day.

Anti-Bullying Policy

Charlotte County Public Schools does not tolerate bullying, which includes cyberbullying. Throughout the school year, our schools do a variety of classroom, large group, and small group lessons on bullying and bully prevention.

Though we teach all of our students that bullying is wrong, it still occasionally occurs. And, while we would like cases of bullying to be reported to the administration, they are not always reported.

Parents - if you have a bully (or cyberbullying) concern please let us know. If your child is a target and is being bullied or if you believe your child bullies others, please let us know. Open and consistent communications with the school will not only help your child but will help many others and the school. Unfortunately, some bully situations take a number of interventions before it subsides. Please continue to communicate with the school and provide any additional information that will help the school put an end to the situation.

It is important to note that investigation of cyberbullying can occur regardless of whether the bullying was conducted using public or private property (cell phone, computers, etc). Please reference Florida Statute 1006.47
