Twelve students from faculty moderator Ted Cotti's Nordhoff High School's Journalism class earned five awards, including a third place finish in the Sweepstakes race, the Tri-County Journalism Educators' Association annual Write-Off competition, held May 21 at California Lutheran University.

The TCJEA includes 35 schools in Ventura, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties.

NHS individual award winners included junior Malina Cate who earned first place for her feature photo and second place for her news photo. Fellow junior photographer Madison Parnell earned Honorable Mention. Senior Nathan Duque earned first place for his editorial cartoon, and fellow senior (and Ranger co-managing editor) Andrea Hernandez – who will be attending California Lutheran University in the fall – earned third place honors for her news story.

The third place Sweepstakes finish is the highest ever for The Ranger.

4K, DRONES, AND 3D VISUAL EFFECTS OH MY!

I am very excited to announce some new technologies coming to the video production program here at Nordhoff. The advanced class now has access to 4k cameras and drones. Both these newer technologies have become the current industry standards when it comes to format and aerial cinematography. 3D special effects is not a new technology but until now wasn't something that students had access to in the form of in- class training. Adobe After Effects is now part of the curriculum. Intro students will be learning how to create 3D titles/Logos and motion tracking. Advanced students will learn more advanced tools like roto brushing, light wrapping and maybe some particle effects depending on how far each student wants to take the information they will have access to. Also keep an eye open for future updates as an ambitious group of students is also going to try and bring back a NHS news show that will be shown in classes across campus and posted to a YouTube channel. For juniors, it is the only chance to gualify to become a National Merit Scholar. Students who take the PSAT do better on the SAT and ACT tests, the scores of which are extremely important for college admissions. AFTER COSTA RICA TRIP, L.I.V.E. CLUB ENTERS SECOND YEAR

In July, a group of seven Nordhoff students - Isabella Gomez, Lexi Stone, Mayra Murillo, Madison Parnell, Raya Whittington, Abigail Vanderwyk, and Riley Leis - and two teachers - Gabrielle Taylor and Janet Calkins - spent a week in Southern Costa Rica living and working with a rural, indigenous tribe, the Bribri. While there, they worked on to contribute to ongoing community development projects, digging trenches and installing pipelines in order to bring clean, fresh water to the community. This service learning trip was part of the club Leadership through International Volunteer Expeditions (L.I.V.E.), a new student organization that launched at Nordhoff last year. In the 2017-2018 school year, the L.I.V.E. team worked to plan fundraisers and community outreach events in order to fund this service trip themselves, eventually raising a total of over \$15,000, which enabled all the team of seven to take the trip to Costa Rica.

Thank you to all the sponsors who contributed and helped make L.I.V.E.'s first year so successful! Thank you especially to the Ojai Optimist Club, to Linda Jordan of the Nordhoff Parent Association, and to Leslie Clark of Nomad Gallery -we couldn't have done it without your help and support!

At the beginning of the new school year, L.I.V.E. will be recruiting and assembling its team for the 2018-2019 school year, which will culminate in an international service trip in summer 2019. HEALTH SCIENCE ACADEMY (HSA)

Welcome incoming HSA students! We are celebrating the **eleventh** year of Nordhoff's exciting Health Science Academy program! The HSA is a 3-year elective Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway that allows students to study health science at the high school level. We offer field trips, guest speakers and many opportunities for career exploration, through volunteer work and job shadows.

Welcome to our new HSA Director, Mrs. Naiyma Houston and also welcome to our new Emergency Medical Responder teacher, Mrs. Becky Perry!

Students typically enter the HSA as sophomores, when they take Medical Terminology from Mrs. Naiyma Houston, who is CTE-credentialed based on her former career in biotechnology. Medical Terminology is a science language class that introduces students to the terms used in medicine through a thematic, body systems approach.

Junior year, students study Anatomy and Physiology (A & P) with Ms. Lisa Porto, who has taught in the Academy since 2012. A & P is an active, hands-on class in which students learn about the human body through labs, projects, activities and animal dissections.

Senior year, students complete a capstone course, Emergency Medical Responder, with Ms. Becky Perry, whose CTE credential is based on her career in the medical field. This skills class prepares students for further study in Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) programs and provides a solid foundation for nursing programs, premed and other health-related disciplines.

Academy students generally have several classes together each year and become close during their time at Nordhoff. Students who complete the following courses plus 20 hours of volunteer service in the health sciences receive the Golden Sash at the Awards Ceremony at the end of their Senior year: Chemistry P or Introduction to Chemistry, Medical Terminology, Anatomy and Physiology, and Emergency Medical Responder. Students who complete 3 out of the 4 courses plus the service requirement receive the Silver Sash.

CITIZENSHIP PROGRAM AND GRADE

The Ranger Pride Citizenship program reinforces the OUSD character traits through a school-wide citizenship grade. Traits such as punctuality, honesty, self-control, responsibility, and respect are monitored, and when students fail to meet these basic expectations for appropriate behavior in and out of the classroom, their grade will be impacted.

Since we expect all students to practice our district-wide character traits, every NHS student begins the year with 100 points, which equals an A+. If a student is tardy to class, violates the dress code or cell phone policy, receives a classroom referral, or earns a suspension from school, their citizenship grade will drop according to the point deductions below:

Points	Grade	Campus violations	Point deduction
100-90	А	Tardy, Citizenship violation –(littering, minor classroom issues)	5 points
89-80	В	Lunch detention, dress code/cell phone violations, campus violations	10 points
79-70	С	Classroom referral, truancies, SARB letters	15 points
69-60	D	In-house suspension	30 points
59-0	F	At-home suspension	50 points

When a student's grade drops below 60 points, which equals an F, the student will lose campus privileges such as dances, rallies, athletic and performing arts participation, and other extracurricular activities. We update grades approximately every two weeks so it is important that students and guardians / parents monitor this grade on their Student/Parent Connect account.

If a student needs to raise their grade, they can seek any teacher, staff member, or administrator to work back some lost points by helping in the classroom or on campus. Students will earn back 5 points for every 30 minutes of work. The supervising adult will email Mr. Hall to report time worked. Staff members also nominate students weekly to earn citizenship points through random acts of kindness, such as helping a teacher or administrator without being asked, or assisting a student in need.

In our experience, some students can quickly earn a failing grade with multiple tardies or other behavioral issues. If students are late to class, they should be prepared to do some work sooner rather than later in order to avoid the loss of campus privileges.




NORDHOFF DANCE ALLIANCE
