Every School Day Counts

- An estimated 5 million to 7.5 million U.S. students miss nearly a month of school each year.
- Research shows that missing 10 percent of school days, or about 18 days in most school districts, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's just two days a month and that's known as chronic absence.
- Chronic absence is a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
- When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their school performance.
- Good attendance is an important life skill.



Parents play a key role in school attendance. Let your student know it is the expectation. Establish homestudy routines and sleep habits that make attendance a non-issue. Encourage participation in school clubs, organizations, and sports. Monitor his/ her progress and talk about it. <u>Students who are engaged at home</u> and at school rarely miss a day.

Parking On Campus

Students who drive to school must have a valid North Gaston Parking Permit. See LTC Smith (ROTC instructor) to purchase your permit. You will need....

- 1. Valid Driver's License
- 2. License Plate Information
- 3. Completed Parking Permit Information form
- 4. The cost is \$25

School Attendance

Attendance is key to success in all courses. Students are expected to attend all classes each school day. Please do your very best to avoid leaving campus; make arrangements for appointments after school hours when possible. Attendance means.....

- 1. A student is present in each class for 75 of the 90 minutes. *Missing 15 minutes results in an absence for the class period.
- Students may not miss more than 10 days in each class. *Missing more than 10 days results in students going through an attendance appeal request process IF they are passing the course.
- 3. Students are responsible for all work missed when they are absent for class; for any reason (excused or unexcused). *Failure to ask the teacher for make-up work or not completing make-up work will result in poor grades and a lower course grade overall.

Behavior Expectations

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that keeps our school environment safe and without disruptions. Below are the minimum expectations every day. These expectations are school-wide:

- 1. Remove all headgear upon entering the building. We want to see you.
- 2. Keep all cell phones 'OFF & AWAY' during ALL class time; this includes NO CELL PHONES in the restrooms. If you must leave the classroom during
