BLOOD DONATION SAVES LIVES <u>AND</u> YOU CAN DONATE BLOOD AT SCHOOL!

Did you know that North Port High School hosts blood drives throughout the year, right on our campus? Our next blood drive is on February 13th. Are you interested in donating blood? Here are some fun facts about saving lives with blood donations:

- You can save up to three lives by donating blood.
- You can burn up to 650 calories per pint of blood donation.
- Donating at least once a year could reduce your risk of a heart attack by 88%.
- When you donate blood, your body replaces the blood volume within 48 hours of donation, and all the red blood cells you lose during donation are completely replaced within four to eight weeks. This process of replenishment can help your body stay healthy and work more efficiently and productively.
- Donating MAY help lower the risk of cancer by maintaining healthy levels of iron in the body.
- Blood drives hosted by companies, schools, places of worship, and civic organizations supply roughly half of all blood donations across the US.
- Giving blood will not decrease your strength.
- After donating blood, you replace the fluid in hours and the red blood cells within four weeks. It takes eight weeks to restore the iron lost after donating.

Here are some more fun facts about blood!

- There is about .2 mg of gold in your bloodstream.
- In an average lifetime the human heart pumps 1.5 million barrels of blood (that's enough to fill 200 train tank cars).
- Your blood accounts for 8% of your body weight.
- Your body has over 100,000 miles of blood vessels. which if laid end to end, would stretch 2 and a half times around the Earth.
- There are 150 billion red blood cells in one ounce of blood.
- All blood isn't red. Crabs have blue blood while earthworms and leeches have green blood.
- O+ is the most common blood type & Odonors are often called "Universal Donors".
- 45% of donors are type "O".
- Most donated red blood cells can be stored for 42 days.
- Whole blood can be donated every 56 days.

The requirements for seniors to receive a donor cord are as follows:

- · Donate three times during their senior year
- Volunteer for 30 hrs during their senior year

Suncoast Blood Bank tracks the donations and volunteer hours.

SCHOOL STAFF-SUPERVISED TUTORING



NJROTC STUDENTS LEAD AND LEARN

Our school's NJROTC program offers a variety of opportunities for students. The goal of JROTC is to motivate young people to become better citizens; NJROTC also teaches students the Navy's three core values - Honor, Courage, and Commitment. An average week in NJROTC consists of learning academics and physical training. On an academic day, cadets will learn maritime history, leadership and followership, the structure of the U.S. government, or history of JROTC and the United States. On physical fitness days, cadets will do a multitude of workouts and run. Additionally, we wear a uniform once a week. Our Senior Naval Science Instructor (SNSI), Lieutenant Commander Barnes USN Ret., says, "If you can't wear a uniform once a week, how are you going to wear one every day after high school?"

The course offers extracurricular activities as well. We have seven different teams that practice after school. Mondays are for the Marksmanship team, where we learn how to shoot air rifles and all about firearm safety, and Color Guard team where we learn manual of arms and how to present the colors. Tuesday is for the Drone Team where we learn how to control drones with precision, and Athletics Team that has more intensive physical training than in class. Wednesday is for Academics Team, where we extend general understanding of military knowledge, and Cyber Patriot Team where we learn how to assess vulnerabilities in computers. Thursday is only for Orienteering, since it is the team with the largest population

this year. In orienteering, we learn how to use a compass and read maps to navigate through complex courses. Friday has no practice since it's before the weekend.

JROTC is a "cadet-run program", meaning we do everything from coordinate all our events, make sure cadets paperwork is updated, and keep inventory of all our supplies. We've successfully coordinated and attended many events this year, including Academics, Marksmanship, and Cyber Patriot competitions. The first competition we attended this year was an Academic Brain Brawl at Boca Raton High School, and we placed 2nd out of 16 teams. The following weekend we attended another Brain Brawl at Gaither High School, and we placed 8th out of 32 teams. We've been very active and successful this year.

NJROTC is the best program to prepare students for life after high school. Cadets are put in awkward situations that make them come out of their shells. They are given positions where they will have to act as a leader. We have a book just for seniors, that tells them what they will need to do if they are going into the work force, military, or furthering their education. Additionally, JROTC focuses highly on building a team. Everyone in the classroom becomes friends by the end of the first quarter, having a good bond in the unit is essential. Our NSI and SNSI, along with our Commanding Officer Cadet Lieutenant Commander Alexa Cortes (Class of 2023), Executive Officer Cadet Lieutenant Junior Grade Danny Gonzalez (Class of 2023), and Operations Officer Cadet Ensign Jordan Wager (Class of 2024), all work hard to ensure success in their cadets.
