Teacher Spotlight

Teacher Of The Year

On May 8, 2019, Oak Park's very own music teacher, Shane Swezey, was selected as a state Teacher of the Year finalist. Jacob Oliva, Chancellor of Public Schools, Paul Burns, Deputy Chancellor for Educator Quality and their team from the Florida Department of Education, joined school district staff and administration at Oak Park School to surprise Mr. Swezey. He is one of five finalists to compete for the 2020 statewide Teacher of the Year.



Clinic Corner

As we start wrapping up another great year at the Oak Park Clinic, we are asking parents to help us with a few administrative matters.

First, if your student currently has daily, emergency, or as needed medications in the clinic, they need to be signed out no later than 4:00PM on May 28th. Any medications not signed out by May 28th will be discarded.

Second, if your student will be taking medications at Oak Park next year, we will need medical authorization forms signed by the student's physician for each medication your student will be taking at school. Medical authorization forms expire at the end of each school year, so we need new medical authorization forms for each medication your child will take during the 2019-2020 school year. Next year's forms may be returned to the clinic starting now. You may send the forms in with your child, drop them off at the front office, or mail them to the school.

Third, if your student will be receiving treatments (tube feeding, nebulizer, inhaler, blood sugar monitoring) at Oak Park next year, we will need treatment authorization forms signed by the student's physician for each treatment your student will be receiving at school as well as a notarized release signed by the parent/guardian. Treatment authorization and release forms expire at the end of each school year, so we need new treatment authorization and release forms for each treatment your child will be receiving during the 2019-2020 school year. Next year's forms may be returned to the clinic starting now. You may send the forms in with your child, drop them off at the front office, or mail them to the school.

Speaking of next school year, the 2019-2020 school year starts August 12, 2019. You may begin signing in your child's medications in the clinic as early as August 5, 2019, between the hours of 9:00AM and 4:00PM.

Did you know? We are permitted to give your student certain over-the-counter medications (Vaseline, insect spray, diaper cream, and certain pain relievers) provided that we have an authorization form signed by a parent/guardian and the parent/guardian hand carries the medication to the clinic in an unopened, original store-issued container.

The spectrum wing of Oak Park has been mixing things up this semester. The three middle school classes of Mrs. Duckworth, Mrs. Falconer, and Mrs. Reiter, have been experiencing fantastic educational and life skill changes. The students are split into three different groups, and Math, Science and Social Studies are being held in respective classrooms four afternoons a week. They have been successfully learning how to work together in class and in the hall as they transition from class to class the Panther Way. They have RESPECT for others space. They are RESPONSIBLE for their own actions. They are STAYING ON TASK by walking on the right, in a straight line and listening to their teacher's instructions. Finally, they ACCEPTING that in life, schedules and routines can change.

Bringing the middle school experience of traveling from subject to subject, as well as getting to know and work with different classmates, helps develop social skills for everyone. This approach has opened the door to a wonderful new world at the middle school level for Spectrum students at Oak Park School.

Kate Walthall's class has been increasing their employability skills

all year by working VERY hard on MANY different pre-job tasks and skills! They started off the year exploring jobs, job skills and other pre-employment tasks students might be interested in doing one day as paid employees. The students used symbol pictures, wrote down what jobs and tasks they preferred, and then started

learning small parts of the job/tasks by using a structured task box system that they can implement independently. Once those skills are mastered, the students are given the opportunity to expand that task to a broader job skill! Some of the job skills the students have been working on are making/packaging/ selling dog biscuits (including collecting and logging pre-orders), making greeting cards to sell, prepping/sewing Autism Awareness aprons, creating visual communication boards for our district ESE trainer/parent make-n-take night/50 summer school classes, classroom recycling pick-up, prep paper for shredding, Shredding paper, making paper, filling bean bags with shredded paper, making campfire starters with shredded paper, Personal "Panther" Shopping at Wal-Mart, rolling silverware, sweeping floors, wiping tables, washing/drying/putting dishes away, counting money and rolling coins, flyer prep, envelope stuffing, packing/unpacking boxes, using a stapler, hole puncher, laminator, paper cutter, ironing (supervised), photo copy machine (supervised), 400 pencils sharpened for FSA testing, sorting office supplies, cutting/ pasting/counting BoxTops, watering plants, washing and folding laundry and scanning/ bagging at Wal-Mart!!!
