The 28-member group is composed of incredibly dedicated students that also participate in spring sports, our spring musical, all-state, and all-county musical ensembles. Their show "Fuel" takes the audience through a journey of building

something from nothing, encountering colossal failure, and persevering with resilience to achieve a monumental goal in the face of adversity. The performers become a character, loosely inspired by the famous mechanic-racer Ken Miles, in which they tune and race the famous Ford GT40 to take the checkered flag at LeMans.
