SERVINGS: 8

PREPPING TIME: 30 MIN

COOKING TIME: 45 MIN

Ingredients

Land 3/4 cups (220g) all-purpose flour or whole wheat

Hour (or mix of both)

I teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking sada

t/2 teaspoon salt

t and 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1/1 teaspoon ground nutmeg

L/2 cup (120ml) vegetable oil (or melted cocount oil)

1/2 cup (100g) granulated sugar

1/3 packed light or dark brown sugar

2 large eggs, at room temperature

2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract

Z Tablespoons (30ml) milk (dairy or non dairy) 1 and 3/4 cups (about 190g) shredded zucchini (no

need to blot)

optional: 1 cup (180g) semi-sweet chocolate chips (or

chopped nuts, raisins, etc)

optional: coarse sugar, for sprinkling on top

Directions

 Preheat oven to 425°F (218°C). Spray a 12-count mulfin pan with nonstick spray or line with cupcake liners.

2. Whisk the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg together in a large bowl. Set aside. In a medium bowl, whisk the oil, granulated sugar, brown sugar, eggs, vanilla extract, and milk together. Whisk in the shredded zucchini. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and whisk or stir until just combined. Fold in any add-ins you want to include, if any. Avoid over-mixing, Batter is thick.


3.Spoon the batter into liners filling them all the way to the top. Sprinkle with coarse sugar, if desired.

4.Bake for 5 minutes at 425°F (218°C); then, keeping the mulfins in the oven, reduce heat to 350°F (177°C) and continue baking for another 15–17 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. The total time these mulfins take in the oven is about 20–21 minutes, give or take. (For mini mulfins, bake 11–13 minutes at 350°F (177°C) the whole time.)

5.Allow the muffins to cool for 5 minutes in the muffin pan, and then transfer to a wire rack to continue cooling, or enjoy warm.
