We are pleased to welcome everyone to the 2021-2022 school year. The purpose of this newsletter is to share important information that you will need during this school year. Parents are encouraged to review the enclosed information with their students and contact us should questions arise.

I am very proud to announce that our school recently received an "A" grade from the Department of Education. This marks our 10th consecutive year of receiving this honor. We were also recognized as a US News and World Reports top 100 high school in Florida for the 4th straight year. This grade and national acknowledgment reflects the hard work of our dedicated teachers, students, support staff and you the parents. Congratulations!

Osceola Fundamental High School will continue to operate on a seven-period schedule with **START AND ENDING TIMES OF 7:25AM TO 1:55PM**, Monday through Friday. Free breakfast will be served daily to all students from 6:50am to 7:15am. We will operate with two designated lunch periods starting after 4th period. Each student will either have first or second lunch period designated within their schedule. Lunch is also free for all students. In an effort to increase student choices, and in an effort to reduce wait time, our food services will provide vending machines with nutritious foods and beverages.

Hats off to Todd Belair, Head Plant Operator, and our wonderful plant operations staff for doing another outstanding job in deep cleaning our classrooms and beautifying our school grounds over the summer break. The facility looks great! Please know that Pinellas County Schools will continue to maintain enhanced district mitigation practices for COVID-19 regarding: air filtration, cleaning and disinfecting within all district buildings, schools and buses.

For your planning purposes please note that our "Back to School Night" will be held virtually on Tuesday, August 31st from 6:00pm to 8:00pm. School Advisory Council (SAC), the Parent, Teacher and Student Association (PTSA) and our Booster Association will meet monthly beginning in September. TIPS FOR SUCCESS

1. Time management is essential.

- Complete all assignments and turn in on time.
- Prepare for tests and projects by planning.
- Balancing academics and extracurricular activities can be challenging but is possible to do by avoiding procrastination.
- 2. Organization and being responsible are key.
 - Set goals and prioritize to complete tasks.
 - "Know how you learn and study in areas that are conducive to learning while avoiding distractions." *
 - Know how to study for each subject area.
 - "Take good notes and study them." *
 - "Utilize test taking strategies." *
 - Read for comprehension of the material.
 - Use your own words to avoid plagiarism and give credit to others.
- 3. Strive for perfect attendance.
 - Both physical and mental presence contribute to the acquisition of knowledge.

4. Communication is important.

- Seek help when necessary.
- Express concerns with a trusted adult.
- 5. "Reduce Test Anxiety." *
 - "Be prepared and arrive early." *
 - "Get a good night's sleep and eat a nutritious breakfast." *
 - "Stay focused on the task at hand (not others), use calm breathing and positive thoughts." *
 - "Watch the clock" * and pace yourself.
 - "Just start and read carefully." *


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

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ATTENDANCE COUNTS

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job. **DID YOU KNOW?**

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other potentially serious difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10 percent, or about 18 days, of the school year can drastically affect a student's academic success.
- Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from college and keep a job.

WHAT YOU CAN DO.

- Make school attendance a priority.
- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day, make that the expectation.
- Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomach aches may be signs of anxiety.

HELP YOUR TEEN STAY ENGAGED.

- Find out if your child feels engaged by his classes and feels safe from bullies and other threats. Make sure he/she is not missing class because of behavioral issues and school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, work with your school.
- Stay on top of academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors if necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.

COMMUNICATE WITH THE SCHOOL.

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties
- Talk to teachers if you notice sudden changes in behavior. These could be tied to something going on at school.
- Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not piling up.
- Ask for help from school officials, after-school programs, other parents or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your child to school.
