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

Attendance- Attendance is one of the most vital components of a child's academic success.**



Did you know that 2 days of missed school a month equates to about 22 academic days a year, which overtime is the equivalent to an entire month of school missed? Consider the following: If a student continues this trend for a few years, 2 days a month, equates to a month of school missed over the course of a year which in turn equates to a full years' worth of missed school over a child's k-12 educational career.




Your student's presence in class on time, every day is vital for their academic success. Please find below a brief overview of how to document a student's absence and what our different attendance code language means. When your student is absent, please call: (239) 377-2400 and press 1.

Excused Absences- Excused absences are only documented with a doctors or other professional's note.

Validated Absences- Validated absences are those in which a parent calls and notifies our school of their child's absence (sick, family matter, travel, etc.) These absences are not considered excused and may impact a child's credits and or truancy if deemed excessive.

Unexcused Absence- Our school has not been informed of your child's absence. These absences are not considered excused and may impact a child's credits and or truancy if deemed excessive.


