### From the Principal's Desk


**ADMINISTRATION**

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

Some tests take place over the course of two days and if a student misses one of the days they do not get credit for either part. Now, more than ever, students need to be in class every day to assure that they are receiving the most rigorous instruction from now until the end of the year.

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


