

If there are any questions or concerns, I strongly suggest that you contact the office of curriculum and instruction or your student's counselor. Guidance counselors are looking diligently at student course requests. Keep in mind that final course selections are driven by standardized testing and student GPA's.

If your student is requesting an Advanced Studies course, they must turn in their course override sheet in order to be considered for the class. A few dual enrollment college courses through FSW will be offered on the PRHS campus next year. Students will earn college credit upon successful completion of these courses. Enrollment requirements include a college ready ACT, SAT or PERT score and a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.0. Please see your counselor for additional information. Exams are here!

Graduating Seniors - Class of 2019

Seniors who plan to attend college next year will be given a chance to request that their final Palmetto Ridge High School transcript be sent to their college. This will be done through Naviance this year. Seniors will get direction during finals and/or graduation practice. Any student who has taken dual enrollment courses must also make arrangements for their FSW or FGCU transcript to be sent as well, by their college. This can be done at the FSW or FGCU registrar's office. THE STUDENTS ARE ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE FOR MAKING SURE THAT THEIR COLLEGE HAS ALL OF THEIR FINAL INFORMATION. Please check with your child to make sure that they have completed all of the appropriate paperwork.

Financial Aid Night

We will be having one in early September, keep an eye out for the date. We hope to have a FGCU financial aid person here at PRHS to answer all of your questions about financial aid and scholarships. This evening is open to all interested parents! There will also be help here that evening for filling out your actual FAFSA if you have your pin already (Palmetto Ridge HS website, under guidance, under Graduation & course offerings, click on senior class presentation power point).

Rising Seniors - Class of 2020

The Florida State Universities open their applications in August. It pays to be the early bird especially with schools who have rolling admissions! Rising seniors who wish to apply to a Florida school should be working on the following over the summer;

- List of colleges
- Resume list of all sports, clubs, activities, awards etc.
- Ask for letters of recommendation
- College Essay
- Study for SAT/ACT if you wish to retest in the fall.
- Register for September ACT or October SAT if needed.

The <u>FAFSA</u> (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will be available beginning October 1st for the class of 2020. Students will need to use their parent's tax return information. Please go to www.fafsa.ed.gov for more information, or our school web site, guidance tab and then financial aid.

Community Service

Community service sites must be PRE-APPROVED by the guidance department. Forms are available on our school website. IT IS DISTRICT POLICY THAT WE CANNOT GIVE CREDIT UNLESS THE SITE HAS BEEN PRE-APPROVED.

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

Proper Decorum During the Graduation Ceremony

Graduation Ceremony is a very proud time for all seniors, parent, guests, and the PRHS faculty. Many years of hard work and effort by our seniors and family members are honored. Improper behavior (screaming, commentary, air horns, etc.) can put a damper on such a wonderful event. Out of consideration for all who will attend the graduation activities, please adhere to the following rules:

- 1. Everyone would like to hear their graduate's name called as they walk across the stage and receive their diploma. Therefore, ceremony guests are asked to restrict themselves from loud noises or screams when their graduate crosses the stage.
- Items NOT permitted in the stadium during the ceremony are: noise makers (air horns, cow bells, drums, shakers, etc.); coolers, alcoholic beverages, fireworks, silly string, water balloons, beach balls, and any other items that may cause a distraction from the ceremony.
- 3. Law enforcement offers will be present throughout the stadium to ensure the safety of our students and their guests. Please be courteous and use the proper decorum.

Graduation Dress Code




Gentlemen
