

JUNIOR HIGH PARENTS ORGANIZATION (JHPO)


Perrysburg Junior High Parents Organization (JHPO) had a great fall supporting PJHS students, teachers and staff members:

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
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
PJHS LIBRARY MEDIA CENTER

MOCK TRIAL

The middle school mock trial case of *Elsewhere v. Jonas* will soon be in session.

Based on the book, <u>The Giver</u>, by Lois Lowry, this year's case involves allegations of kidnapping and endangering children. The prosecution charged 13-year-old Jonas with these offenses for taking "newchild" Gabriel away from The Community and exposing him to harsh and dangerous conditions without proper clothing or sustenance. Jonas though denies the charges, instead pointing out that he fled The Community to save Gabriel's life and used his special training from the Giver to survive the conditions and protect Gabriel.

The team will meet on Monday afternoons from 2:50 - 4:30 p.m. in room 209. Students will take on the roles of attorneys, witnesses and bailiff/timekeepers. During practices, they will learn trial-practice and procedure skills to prepare for the Middle School Mock Trial Showcase, which takes place in the spring at the Thomas J. Moyer Ohio Judicial Center in downtown Columbus.

Although mock trial itself centers on presenting a case before volunteer judges and attorneys, this extracurricular activity is not only for students who may be interested in a career in the law. In mock trial, students learn and practice the invaluable skills of making coherent and persuasive arguments and "thinking on their feet."


HIPP

NURSE'S NOTES

Are you ready to fight the flu this season?

The best protection against the flu is getting the flu vaccine.

What is the flu?

Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death.

What are flu symptoms?

Flu symptoms are different from a cold. Flu usually comes on suddenly.

People who have the flu often have some of all of these symptoms:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills it is important to note not everyone has a fever
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny/stuffy nose
- · Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatigue
- Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea

How does the Flu Spread?

Most experts believe that flu viruses spread mainly by tiny droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk. These droplets can land in the mouth or nose of people who are nearby. A person might get the flu by touching a surface or objects that has the flu virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose or eyes (called the T-Zone).

Period of Contagiousness

People with the flu virus are most contagious in the first 3-4 days after the illness begins.

Preventing Seasonal Flu

The CDC recommends getting the flu vaccine every year. The CDC also recommends everyday preventive actions like staying away from people who are sick.

- Stay home from school if you are sick. This will help present the spread of illnesses!
- Cover your cough or sneezes with your elbow (do not use your hands).
- Frequently washing your hands will help slow down the spread of germs.
- Do not put your fingers in your eyes, nose or mouth.
