Summer Read

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Student Schedules

Student schedules will be available to be viewed on PowerSchool at 8:00 am on Monday, August 8. There will also be a hard copy of the schedules available at the Orientation Nights. If you notice a mistake on your child's schedule, please email the grade level school counselor. If your child needs to make a change to their schedule, please email the grade level counselor. For example, if your child wants to join a music class, you need to let your counselor know. School Start Date

The PJHS school year begins with a staggered start to provide the students to be in the school with just one grade level for one day. The 8th grade students will begin school on Tuesday, August 16 and then not attend on Wednesday, August 17. There will be a group of about 80 8th grade WEB leaders who have been chosen to help lead activities for the 7th grade students on their first day of school on Wednesday, August 17. These activities will help to welcome the students to PJHS and also get to know older students who will continue to help and support them throughout the school year.

- Tuesday, August 16 = 8th grade only
- Wednesday, August 17 = 7th grade only
- Thursday, August 18 = Both grade levels





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PJHS TALENT SHOW


