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## **COUNSELOR'S CORNER**

#### PSAT

On Wednesday, October 12, Perrysburg Junior High School administered the digital PSAT to all eighth grade students. The digital PSAT 8/9 results are useful for many reasons. First, we will be able to pinpoint specific strengths and challenges in academic areas for your child. Second, this assessment will give us

information to better design current instruction for your child. Third, this assessment will help guide selection of future coursework for your child. This will be especially useful as we meet to discuss your child's transition to high school. Finally, your child will have gained valuable experience with test-taking strategies for success on college entrance exams. We know from experience that the more comfortable a student is with the test format, the better they perform.

Our goal is to prepare your child so that he or she will feel comfortable and prepared for the SAT in their junior year. The PSAT will also help us better advise your child for the high school course selection process this winter. Results will be shared with you in January 2023. People in distress can call and text 988, or chat with someone on 988lifeline.org. People worried about a loved one who may need crisis support may also use these services.

(Acknowledge, Care, Tell). Please ask your child about this visit. Some 7th grade students don't have Health until 2nd semester. Mrs. Monheim will visit them in the Spring.

8th Grade WEB Leaders taught their 1st Lesson, "How to Catch a Positive Attitude," to their 7th grade groups. Great Job, WEB Leaders!


## MATHCOUNTS


