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## **COUNSELOR'S CORNER**

### **IMPORTANT NUMBERS TO KNOW!**

### Safer Ohio School Tip Line - 844-723-3764

This is a free service that accepts calls and texts 24/7 and allows anyone to anonymously share information with school officials and law enforcement about threats to safety.

### Crisis Text Line - text "4hope" to 741 741

People of all ages may reach out by text 24/7 to communicate with someone trained to listen and respond in a method that is free, private, secure and confidential. Data usage while texting Crisis Text Line is free and the number will not appear on a phone bill with the mobile service carrier.

### What is the Lifeline and will 988 replace it?

The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is a national network of over 200 local, independent, and state- funded crisis centers equipped to help people in emotional distress or experiencing a suicidal crisis. By transitioning to 988, the goal is that the three-digit number will be an easier way to access a strengthened and expanded network of crisis call centers. Since July 16, 2022, people in a mental health or addiction crisis can access the Lifeline via 988 or by the 10-digit number 1-800-273-8255. Ohio has 19 Lifeline providers who are actively answering calls in Ohio. In our community, our Lifeline provider is through Lima. Additionally, we have the Wood County Crisis Line that is still available: 419-502-4673. The Wood County Crisis Line is still active and can be called for crisis services in Wood County.

### How is 988 different from 911?

988 was established to improve access to crisis services in a way that meets our country's growing suicide and mental health related crisis care needs. 988 will provide easier access to the Lifeline network and related crisis resources, which are distinct from 911 (where the focus is on dispatching emergency medical services, and police as needed).
