PCS Forms

To review and electronically sign each form:

3. Carefully read the form and discuss with your student.
4. After reading the form, return to this tab on your browser.
5. Some forms simply require an electronic signature. Some forms may have additional information for you to fill in here on the browser. If so, read carefully and enter the requested information.
6. To sign the form electronically, read the signature text near the bottom of the expanded area and check the checkbox if you agree with the text.
7. After clicking the signature checkbox, click the Save/Print button to open the signed form.
8. Save and / or print the form for your records.

Electronically signed forms do not need to be returned to the school.

Minimum 2.0 grade point average
Students must earn at least a 2.0 GPA to receive their diploma. Students with a GPA lower than a 2.0 may be eligible for a certificate of completion. A 2.0 grade point average is also required for participation in sports, clubs, and other extracurricular activities.

State Testing Requirements
Students must pass the following statewide assessments: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Grade 10 ELA FSA (or ACT/SAT concordant score) Algebra I end-of-course (EOC) or earn a concordant score on the ACT/SAT.
Students must participate in EOC assessments in the following subjects: Algebra I, Biology, Geometry, and U.S. History. Results constitute 30 percent of the final course grade.

ABSENCES

If your child will be absent, please call your child's assistant principal's office to notify them. If you reach their voice mail, leave your child's name, grade, reason for absence and the name of the person leaving the message.

You can also report an absence on our website at www.pcsb.org/pp-hs by clicking on the far-right link "Report Student Absence." Make sure to include your child's name, date of birth, grade, date absent and reason. You may attach any supporting documentation if necessary as well.

SUPERVISION TIMES

This is a reminder that the Code of Conduct states parents "will not leave their child at school more than thirty (30) minutes before the start of the school day or pick their child up more than thirty (30) minutes after the school day. Supervision will not be provided beyond that time. This also includes school activities outside the regular school day such as clubs, dances, carnivals, practices, and games."

It is important that parents plan to pick up their student in a timely manner. After school hours students must be with a coach, teacher or club sponsor to remain on campus. Parents must make arrangements to pick up students within 30 minutes of an after-school game or other event.
