Vive la Manie 2022!


"Manie Musicale" is an annual competition of songs modeled after the NCAA March Madness basketball tournament in the U.S. Students in French classes fill out brackets to try to predict which of sixteen songs will win the "championship". Then, once the tournament starts, students vote for their favorite songs to see who wins. Songs include a variety of



contemporary Francophone artists from around the world. Students learn about the artists and their cultures and communicate with each other to describe the songs and share their opinions. Voting begins in March. Qui va gagner?

In 2021, PPHS French classes joined along with over 2000 schools participating from all 50 states and ten countries. Our goal is to have 3000 schools

in Manie 2022. Last year several of the artists sent personal videos or social media posts to Manie Musicale to share with students. We even had a video interview with Mickaël Pouvin from the beautiful French island of La Réunion. His song, Près des Étoiles, was a big hit with many of our students. Vive la musique!

SUPERVISION TIMES

This is a reminder that the Code of Conduct states parents "will not leave their child at school more than thirty (30) minutes before the start of the school day or pick their child up more than thirty (30) minutes after the school day. 
