

Minimum 2.0 grade point average

Students **must** earn at least a 2.0 GPA to receive their diploma. Students with a GPA lower than a 2.0 may be eligible for a certificate of completion. A 2.0 grade point average is also required for participation in sports, clubs, and other extracurricular activities.

State Testing Requirements

Students must pass the following statewide assessments:

- Grade 10 ELA (or ACT/SAT concordant score)
- Algebra I end-of-course (EOC) or earn a comparative score on the (P.E.R.T.). Results from the Algebra I EOC constitute thirty percent of the final course grade when enrolled.

Students must participate in the EOC assessments in the following subjects: Biology, Geometry, U.S. History, and Algebra II (if enrolled). Results constitute 30 percent of the final course grade.

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DISASTER DAY 2019

On Wednesday, April 10, 2019, Pinellas Park High School's First Responder and Criminal Justice Academy seniors participated in a combined Disaster

and Criminal Justice Academy seniors participated in a combined Disaster Day event. Seniors in both programs took hands-on skills they've learned within their respective

programs and applied them to a hospital bombing scenario. First Responder underclassmen were victims, complete with moulage (makeup) to make injuries as real as possible. With the assistance of SunStar, BayFlite, the US Army,







and the Pinellas Park Fire Department, students were able to extricate victims from the auditorium, triage them, and have them transported to local hospitals. They also demonstrated how to work with HAZMAT

at a mass-casualty scene. This is the culmination of 4 years of Emergency Planning & Response training for First Responder students. Senior Noah Kidd, having just earned his Firefighter 1 certification, was assisted by the Pinellas Park Fire Department in extinguishing a fire to kick off Disaster Day and demonstrate his hard work in FF class.

CJA seniors were assigned to squads and worked the scene as an ongoing criminal investigation. They acted as Bomb Squad members with the assistance of the MacDill Air Force Base Explosive Ordnance Disposal Team and their robot to locate and deactivate a secondary device, FBI Agents to conduct suspect and witness interviews, Crime Scene Investigators with the assistance of the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office CSI Unit to collect and process evidence, and perimeter units to maintain the integrity of the scene. The CJA SpecOps juniors provided a felony traffic stop demonstration and apprehended the suspect.

Mr. Romain, the Digital Information Technology teacher, and several of his students deployed drones, GoPros, and digital cameras into and above the scene to provide eyes in the sky and ground coverage of the event. He also spoke to visiting

students and teachers about the advances in drone technology and how drones are being used as another investigative tool in the first responder or criminal justice tool box.

The following week, the Criminal Justice Academy Mock Trial team put on a mock trial of the Disaster Day suspect to provide some closure to the event. The mock trial was open to all teachers, students, and staff to attend and gave the team an opportunity to showcase what they do. Also, First Responder students participated in the VA Bay Pines Hospital Disaster Drill on April 16th. They were victims of a chemical explosion for several local fire departments and for the VA Emergency Room staff. This entire event would not be possible without the gracious support we receive from the community and the teachers who help coordinate the event!




