

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

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Palm Beach County Science and Engineering Fair On December 8th, Polo Park had fourteen students participate in the Palm Beach County

On December 8th, Polo Park had fourteen students participate in the Palm Beach County Science and Engineering fair. From those fourteen students, six were selected to be recognized with awards. Lucas Demattos was recognized by the Navy League of the U.S., Palm Beach Council with the "Outstanding Spirit and Achievement" award. Evan Seith earned a fourth place award for his project. Michael Niemczyk, Emily Ramirez and Laksshita Vishnuvardhan achieved third place awards for their work.

For the sixth time in Polo Park history, we had a student earn first place standing and advance to the state science fair. Alejandro Rincon's project in the category of Environmental Engineering earned a first place award as well as four special recognition awards from the following organizations: The Florida Department of Environmental Protection, The Pollution Prevention Coalition of Palm Beach County, The Ricoh Sustainable Development Award, and the South Florida Water Management District. He will have the honor of representing our school at the 67th Annual State Science and Engineering at the end of March.

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
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Library Media
