See What's Happening in Family and Consumer Science Classes!



I love Gordon Korman's books and this one was no different.

As a library media specialist, I would be remiss if I did not mention the passing of two authors whose work is very near and dear to my heart. Robotics

This has been an interesting Season. We started robotics with about 80 students trying out for the teams. After two weeks of virtual tryouts, we were able to pick three amazing teams.

We started practicing in early October to prepare for our first scrimmage in December. After the December scrimmage, we would have three more scrimmages before our qualifier. When the qualifier came around we were ready for the competition. We were very excited to find out that we moved on to the regionals. During the qualifier all three teams received awards. Team 44893 received the Robot Game Award, Team 16113 received the Robot Design Award, and Team 36112 received the Judges Award.

On to the regionals here, the kids worked even harder and all three teams qualified for the State Invitational. I am not aware of any other school that has qualified three teams for the state tournament. We also received numerous awards. Team 44893 got the Core Values Award, 36112 got the Innovative Project Award, and 16113 got the Robot Game Award.

After that we got ready for the state tournament on May 21-23. These were the result of their hard work. The 36112 Rockin Robots took 3rd place in state innovative project. The 44993 Techno Rebels took 1st place in the state for Robot Design and 2nd place in the state for Robot Performance! With a Score of 470! The 16113 Projectia team place 3rd place in state robot performance with a score of 450 and they received the 2nd place Champions Award (Runner Up to all 51 teams in the state)

People who are not involved with the robotics program have no idea the dedication these students put in to be the best at what they do. I am so proud of every one of them for what they have done this year. I will miss the 8th-grade student on our team. The majority of them have been with us all three years and I want to thank them for everything. The future is bright for Polo Park Robotics and it is also bright for the students who have built this program. Congratulations to all.





The Pajama Project

Pajamas seem like the most basic of necessities for a young child. Whether they are covered in superheroes or princesses, they are the first step to sweet dreams.

Unfortunately, there are too many kids who do not have this simple comfort. That's where the Polo Park Middle School Kindness Ambassadors Club (KAC) comes in. In order to make an impact on others and promote positivity, the KAC started The Pajama Project where they collected pajamas and books for donation to kids in foster care in Palm Beach County.

"Our mission is to make an impact and promote positivity in our school and community through simple acts of kindness," said Chelsea Solorzano, one of the staff sponsors for the Kindness Ambassadors Club.

The extremely successful drive got over 100 sets of pajamas and over 50 new books for donation to the children in need.

"We had a representative come to the club (virtually) and talk with the students about the project and what they represent," said Solorzano. The Parent-Teacher-Student Association (PTSA) also pitched by announcing the project using social media outlets.

At the moment the club has two faculty sponsors, Solarazona and Thamires Dos Anjos, and 15 students that are already a part of the group. The club meets twice a month to come up with ways to do big or small acts of kindness to benefit local people.

Especially today, sticking together and showing kindness is important when someone is struggling. The pandemic has caused a lot of stress on everyone and the KAC is a helpful reminder that there are people out there who want to help in any way they can.

The club has done small acts of kindness on campus for staff members as well as much larger acts of kindness like making Valentine's Day cards for nursing homes.

The KAC is always coming up with new ways to help spread kindness. Through the community there have been three collections this year, including The Soup Kitchen, where the club had collected food for Thanksgiving meals to give to the Palm Beach County residents to help their community.

This year the club also made The Forgotten Soldiers Collection where they collected items to create care packages so they could send them to soldiers that are overseas.

The KAC is open for any Polo Park student to join where they will then have the opportunity to make a difference and convince others to show kindness to people they come across.

Spreading this positivity helps the club too. Being kind to the school and local area makes a stronger bond with the students, staff, and parents in the community.

This year already, everyone in the club has impacted the community tremendously. As the Kindness Ambassadors Club continues to grow, the members will continue to create good will within their school and with the people in their community.
