Hi everyone, happy summer. I hope everyone can find time to relax and read. In May, I worked closely with the ELA department to come up with Polo Park's Summer Reading Program. Your child should have received information from their ELA teacher, otherwise you can find all the details at my library website: https://sites.google.com/palmbeachschools.org/poloparkvirtuallibrary/home

This year students are required to read a 2022-2023 Sunshine State Young Readers Award (SSYRA) book of their choice. There are 15 titles to choose from and students must complete an assignment that will be turned in to their ELA teacher by August 19th. Students will earn a grade for their work, so they want to do a good job.

In addition, for all those readers out there, I have a Summer Reading Challenge, which is optional. You can find that on my website as well. If you complete my challenge we'll have some fun, food, and prizes when we return to school in August. The challenge must be completed and turned in to me by August 19 in the library media center. You may use your required book to fill one of the categories.

I'd like to thank St. Peters Methodist Church for the five-hundred-dollar donation for summer reading books and a special thanks to Ms. Beach for making it happen. Their donation helped to put summer reading books in the hands of some of our students.

Since we ask the students to read from the SSYRA books, I schedule my summer reading around them as well. So far I've read Amari and the Night Brothers by B.B. Alston, Archimancy Shadow School by J. A. White, and Curse of the Night Witch by Alex Aster. If you like fantasy and/or mythology, I highly recommend these three titles. I enjoyed Curse of the Night Witch so much, I immediately downloaded the sequel to my phone. The sequels to the other two are not out yet, I checked. Next on my list will be Rivals by Tommy Greenwald.




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

Another Banner Year for Polo Park Athletics

After a year of no sports at the middle school level, Polo Park picked up right where they left off a few years ago, producing a winning team in all 10 sports while claiming five Western Division titles, six teams qualifying for the county playoffs, four teams making it the final four and one team, Boys Baseball, winning the Palm Beach County Championship. Here's a review of the great success the Stallions achieved this year:

Back in the fall, the 2021-22 season began with a bang as the boys baseball team finished with a 9-1 regular season record, earned the number one seed in the playoffs and then knocked off rival Wellington Landings in the semi-finals and perennial powerhouse Christa McAuliffe in the finals en route to the country title. This was the second baseball championship in school history, the first coming back in 2008, also against Christa McAuliffe. The girls softball team played equally as well, finishing with a 7-3 overall record, two of which were one run losses, and missing out on the playoffs by one game. The team was strong both offensively and defensively, as well as getting excellent pitching performances in every game.

The next sports window saw superb performances by both the girls volleyball team and the boys soccer team. The girls volleyball team, in fact, had a historic year, going 10-0 in the regular season without dropping one game in any match (33 straight game wins), winning their second consecutive Western Division title, and getting to the final four of the county playoffs. The boys soccer team was just as impressive, finishing the regular season with only one loss and one tie and earning their own playoff bid. Though the season ended in the quarterfinals, the team did win one playoff round and produced another extremely strong season.

Following Winter Break, the Stallions winter teams picked up right where the fall teams left off. The girls basketball team finished with an impressive 9-1 regular season record and their third straight Western Division crown. The team also picked up one win in the playoffs, making it to the quarterfinals. The boys basketball team got off to a slow start, hitting the midpoint of the season with a 3-3 record after a pair of close losses. However, the grit and determination the team had was clear as they rattled off four straight wins, including one over division leader Crestwood, just barely missing out on the playoffs. The third winter team, girl's soccer, continued their dominance of the division, winning the title for the fifth straight season, this time with an undefeated 9-0-1 record. After earning a bye as the number one seed in the playoffs and winning in the second round of the postseason, the team went to the county semi-finals and finished the entire season without losing one game in regulation, only getting knocked out of the playoffs in penalty kicks.

The final season saw the return of boys and girls track and field as well as boys volleyball, three sports that had not seen competition since 2019. The track teams battled through a shortened season and dodged some stormy weather to find both individual and team success during their four meets. Both squads qualified a pair of relay teams for the county championships as well as another three competitors who competed individually in events. The final sport, boys volleyball, returned to prominence after a nearly 20 year drought, winning their first division title since 2003 with an 8-2 record. The team backed up their stellar regular season with a playoff win and a trip to the county quarter finals.

A special congratulation to 8th graders Tyler Johnson and Ashlyn Nevarez, this year's Male and Female Athlete of the Year. Tyler led the baseball team to the County Championship as well as helping the volleyball team to a division title. Ashlyn was a three sport star, leading the softball team as well as a starter for the basketball team and a contributor to the track and field team.

This great sports year was a testament to the outstanding athletes that Polo Park continues to produce, as well as some excellent coaching. Thanks go out to Coach Kaliser (Baseball and Girls Soccer), Coach Torres (Boys Soccer and Girls Basketball), Coach Besman (Girls Volleyball), Coach Pryor (Boys Basketball), Coach Hansen (Boys Track and Field), Coach Kohl (Girls Track and Field) and Coach Drogovich (Boys Volleyball) for doing such a great job leading their teams.

A very SPECIAL thanks to Athletic Director (and Softball Coach) Stacy Blackford for her tireless leadership and dedication to the athletic programs and the student-athletes at Polo Park.
