

PCHS NJROTC

2021 Annual Military Inspection

This past December 2021, Port Charlotte High School NJROTC (Navy Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps) held an Annual Military Inspection (AMI), a yearly event in which all NJROTC units participate. The cadet personnel inspection, the ceremonial phase, a pass-in review, and a cadet staff brief are all part of AMI. Our guest inspector this year was USN Retired Lieutenant Commander Dempsey Barnes, the Senior Naval Science Instructor of North Port High School NJROTC. Commander Barnes inspected each cadet individually during the Personnel Inspection, quizzing them on their Navy Knowledge, and inspecting their uniform. Our Unit Commanding Officer, Cadet Lieutenant Commander Devin Richter, presented the Pirate Company and was the first to be inspected. The remaining Cadet Staff were then inspected as follows: Executive Officer, Cadet Lieutenant Mackenzie Gay, Operations Officer, Cadet Lieutenant Junior Grade Jazmin Reinhardt, and Senior Enlisted Advisor, Cadet Chief Select Salina Tuthill.

Immediately following Personnel Inspection, the Pirate Company marched to the football field, where parents and family members were invited to watch as the Cadets performed a Color guard and Drill Demonstration. Our Admin Officer, and one of our two Chief Selects for PCHS NJROTC, Cadet Chief Select Travis Waller, was the Master of Ceremonies (MC) for the event. Cadet Chief Select Waller introduced LCDR (ret.) Barnes as well as our SNSI, Lieutenant Commander (ret.) Sonja Harry, and our NSI, Chief Petty Officer (ret.) Geoffrey Dufur. Following them were our Principal, Mr. Long, and Assistant Principals Dr. Curtis and Mrs. Forbus, who were also invited to speak and observe the AMI. After the drill demonstration, our guest inspector, instructors, and faculty were invited to say a few words of congratulations, and all cadets were then dismissed to continue with their day, apart from cadet staff. The next and final part of AMI for the Cadet Staff was the Staff Inspection.

Before the day of AMI, a lot of effort and planning went into ensuring the day went off without a hitch. Platoon Commanders reviewed NJROTC Knowledge with their classes and Cadet Staff reviewed and prepared the unit for inspection by LCDR Barnes. A substantial portion of the Cadet Staff Inspection was the PowerPoint Presentation. Each Staff member presented two - three slides, detailing their position on staff and in the unit, why they joined NJROTC, what they have done to arrive where they are now, and their plans following high school such as work, or military service. Our cadet staff were vigorously questioned by LCDR Barnes to assess how well they do their jobs and cadet staff provided thorough answers to all questions. Following the Staff Presentation, our Commanding Officer, Executive Officer, Operations Officer, Supply Officer, and Admin Officer were quizzed on their knowledge of CDMIS, our database for uniform/ribbon/rank tracking, diversity percentages, end of year report, and cadet records. The latter concluded the last part of the day for the cadet staff, and our guest inspector finished the day by meeting with the school administration and our NJROTC instructors. AMI was a success!

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
