





# **Drop-off/Pick-up Procedures**

# **AM Drop-Off**

Once traffic has stopped, please have student(s) exit vehicle, and walk on the sidewalk beginning after the bike rack/yellow sign.

Waiting until the door to unload your student causes traffic to back up on Education Avenue and prevents our buses from getting to campus on time.

For safety reasons, students are not allowed to be dropped off in the parking lot.

# PM Pick-Up

Immediately upon dismissal, students may load directly into their cars. After the first line of cars has been released, students must wait on the sidewalk until directed by staff that it is safe to load in their vehicle (please remind your student that this is for their safety).

If your student does not load up when directed and staff directs the car line to exit, you must follow the line and keep moving. Staff may tell you to re-enter parent pick up at the end of the line. This is for the safety of students as well as efficiency for the parent pick up process.

Do not pull into the staff parking lot to pick up your student. Students are not allowed to cross over the parent pick up line.

For the safety of all students, please keep your vehicle at a complete stop until staff releases the line.
