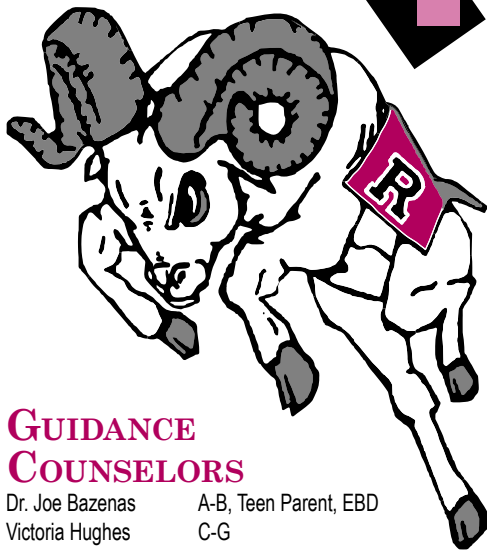

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# HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

## STANDARD DIPLOMA

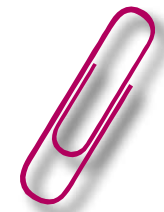
To graduate from high school in 2019, a student must meet the following requirements:

- A student must earn the following credits: 26 and successfully complete all required courses (or equivalent)
- Students must achieve a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale on all courses except for those courses forgiven according to the district forgiveness procedure.
- A student must earn passing scores on the 10th grade FSA ELA in reading. Students are also required to pass the Alg. 1 EOC.

1. A certificate of completion will be awarded to students who: (1) have met all course, credit and GPA requirements, but have not passed one or both sections of the appropriate state tests required for graduation or (2) have passed both sections of the appropriate state tests required for graduation and met all course and credit requirements, but have not met the GPA requirement. Students receiving a certificate of completion may participate in the graduation ceremonies. These students may still pursue a standard diploma through adult education, the GED, or other suitable alternatives.
2. Participation in two seasons of an interscholastic sport at the JV or Varsity level will waive the HOPE requirement. See school counselor for forms.
3. Completion of **two** full years of the ROTC program will waive participation in the HOPE class and will waive the performing art requirement.
4. Detailed information on graduation requirements and non-standard diploma options are available on the RHS website in the Program of Studies and on the district website in the guidance reference manual, **Pathways**, at [www.sarasotacountyschools.net](http://www.sarasotacountyschools.net).
5. **One course must be successfully completed online through SVA or FLVS. This course can be for .5 or 1.0 credit**
6. Students should schedule an appointment to meet with their school counselor to verify graduation status.

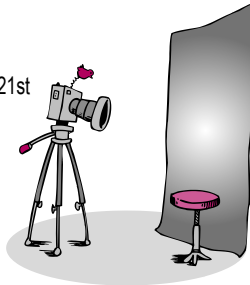

## 10 THINGS YOU CAN DO NOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED IN HIGH SCHOOL

1. Make sure your phone number and home address are up to date with the registrar. Inaccurate information makes it difficult to contact family members.
2. Sign up for the Parent Portal- your chance to view your student's real-time attendance and updated grades. Go to [www.sarasotacountyschools.net](http://www.sarasotacountyschools.net), click on parents and then click on Family Access Portal.
3. Attendance! Attendance and school success are directly related; use the Parent Portal to monitor your student's daily attendance. Make sure absentee notes are turned in right away. If you are getting an automated attendance phone call, your student has missed a class!
4. Using your student's schedule, email their teachers and counselor to introduce yourself and establish email communication.
5. Be proactive- Sarasota Co. Schools is going paperless. Please keep up with crosspointe to monitor your child's grades. The end of the marking periods for 2017-18 are:
  - a. End of quarter one- October 11th
  - b. End of quarter two- December 20th
  - c. End of quarter three- March 11th
  - d. End of quarter four- May 29th
6. Graduation requirements are outlined for each class in the Program of Studies located under the 'Website Menu', then click on Academics on the RHS website.
7. Keep a copy of all of the fact sheets from each of your student's teachers. These outline their grading system and expectations for each class.
8. Create a file folder at home to keep report cards and other school related information in one place.
9. Be familiar with the Bright Futures Scholarship. It changes from year to year. This is your student's opportunity to earn money for college and should always be a goal.
10. Visit [www.sarasotacountyschools.net/schools/riverview](http://www.sarasotacountyschools.net/schools/riverview) for current news and information about RHS- know what's going on.

\*Bonus\* If you are in doubt, ask!  
Be involved, double check the information coming home to you from your student!

## DIPLOMA/CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETIONS PICKUP

Diploma or Certificate of Completions will be available at Riverview High School beginning Tuesday, July 16 through Thursday, July 18th from 10 AM to 12 NOON in the Reception Office. Only you or your parent/guardian may pick up your diploma and a picture ID is required. \*\*Participation in the walking ceremony does not guarantee that all requirements have been met for graduation.

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## SUMMER IDEAS FOR PARENTS

The summer break provides a much needed rest from the rigors of school life, but a complete disconnect from education can make the start of the new school year more difficult for your student. Consider a few ways to engage your child in activities that stimulate learning and provide an opportunity to enhance your relationship. Pick two or three of the following summer opportunities and commit to achieving a common goal with your child.

**READING:** Read two books with your child over the summer. Each of you select a book, read it independently, and talk about it. Everyone identifies different meanings and ideas. These conversations lead to insights, not only about the books but perhaps more importantly, about each other. You may discover that some of your child's interests and perceptions surprise you.

**MOVIES:** See two movies with your child over the summer. Again, each of you pick a movie, see it together, and talk about its effect on you. The benefits of these conversations cannot be overstated. It's not uncommon to discover a point of view that you had never considered. As a result, you will become closer to your child. Many movies are adaptations of popular books or series. Watching them may motivate your child to read the books or others with similar or opposing themes.

**HOMEWORK:** Yes, yards must be tended, cars washed, kitchens cleaned, and trash taken out, but perhaps there are budgets to be discussed, correspondences to write, and bills to be paid. If appropriate, you might consider getting your child involved. Practical applications of math, reading, and writing skills reinforce the importance of education. These skills are vital for a fulfilling life!

**TAKE A CLASS TOGETHER:** Does your student have unexplored interests or passions? There are free online courses in art, music, dance, woodworking, gardening, writing and composition, etc., not to mention math, science, and technology. Encourage your child to select an online class of interest and complete it together. There's no way to predict undiscovered interests and talents.

**FUN and GAMES:** Consider some new outdoor activities. Go hit a bucket of golf balls, or try surfing/water skiing. Host a game of 'Capture the Flag' at home or try paint balling. (Can you remember the joy of besting mom or dad?) Introduce games and activities that you remember from childhood. Encourage your child to practice his/her research skills by looking up rules, tips and strategies before engaging in the activity. If they really enjoy it, have them look further into opportunities for continued involvement. These activities develop and improve communication and social skills. There are numerous parks and recreation centers nearby to play any game or sport inexpensively.

These types of activities not only support the learning process but enhance relationships. Summer is a wonderful time to recover, relax, and reconnect. Make a point of including opportunities to reinforce and develop your child's education. Enjoy your summer!

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## 10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Seniors! Apply now for the Bright Futures Scholarship at: [www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org](http://www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org). Create an account and complete the application. This can be done before community service hours, GPA and SAT/ACT requirements have been met.
2. Create your FSA ID <https://fsaid.ed.gov/> then complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).
3. Search for local and updated scholarship information on [www.LaunchYourPlan.com](http://www.LaunchYourPlan.com), in the Student Success Center, and <https://www.fastweb.com/> for national scholarship searches.
4. Check with the colleges you apply to for internal scholarships. Many of these require a separate application from your admissions application.
5. Check with the companies where you or your parents work and any other affiliated organizations. There are many scholarship opportunities available beyond the ones mentioned!
6. Organize Scholarship applications by due date.
7. Plan ahead for recommendation letters! Counselors require 10 business days to write letters of recommendation. Don't forget to provide your counselor with a resume of your activities while in high school. Pro tip – be sure to follow up with a thank you letter once your recommendation letter is completed!
8. Order copies of your transcript with the registrar at least a week before they need to be submitted with your scholarship applications. Transcript request forms are located in the Attendance Office and in Guidance.
9. Review your Essay. Highlight your accomplishments, goals and note relevant obstacles.
10. Follow the guidelines of the scholarship! It is important to submit a well organized and complete application.
