Thank you for all your support this school year. Every day, students are coming to campus ready to learn. Our goal is for all students to leave Riverview High School college and career ready. To support your student's academic progress, please consult the Focus Portal to check your student's attendance and grades throughout the year. If you have any questions regarding your child's progress, please contact his/her teacher or school counselor for more information. If your child needs support in a class, please take advantage of teachers' office hours that occur twice a week from 7:15a.m.-7:40a.m. You can also look further in the newsletter to find additional opportunities with student tutors or various days/times to meet regarding a specific subject.

Our Student Success Center is open for students as early as 7a.m. We encourage our students to meet with Ms. Ruiz-Tagle, College and Career Advisor, before or after school or during lunches. She is available to help students build their resume(s), apply for college and help with financial aid. In addition, all students have access to SchoolLinks, a college and career advising network. In this system, students can upload resumes, letters of recommendation, sign up for college visits and explore different career paths.

The RHS Foundation has formed a new tradition for our seniors by creating a Senior Story Wall in the breezeway of the main entrance. For \$150, you can give your senior (or a group of seniors) a banner that includes: senior's name(s), message for the senior(s) and a photo that will be put on a 3x4 banner to hang in our breezeway until graduation. 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HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS ENTERING GRADE 9 IN 2024-2025 AND BEYOND

SUBJECT	CREDITS Required	COMMENTS
English	4	English 1, 2, 3, and 4 English honors, College Board Advanced Placement, Advanced International Certificate of Education, International Baccalaureate, and dual enrollment courses may satisfy this requirement
Mathematics	4	One of which must be Algebra 1 and one of which must be Geometry. Industry certifications that lead to college credit may substitute for up to two mathematics credits (except for Algebra 1 and Geometry)
Science	3	One of which must be Biology 1, two of which must be equally rigorous science courses. Two of the three required credits must have a laboratory component. An industry certification that leads to college credit substitutes for up to one science credit (except for Biology 1). An identified rigorous computer science course with a related industry certification substitutes for up to one science (except for Biology 1).

The Algebra 1 EOC and the grade 10 English Language Arts Statewide, Standardized assessment must be passed for a standard diploma.

The comparative concordant score may be used to meet the Algebra 1 and/or grade 10 English Language Arts Statewide, standardized assessment graduation requirement.

Students must take the appropriate End of Course exams as required by the state of Florida and 30% of the end of course exam will be calculated into the final grade for Biology, Geometry, US History, and Algebra 1.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

If your child is hoping to be a member of National Honor Society at some point during their time at RHS, please be aware of the requirements for induction as outlined below.

Requirements for membership:

- Rising 11th or 12th grader
- 3.5 unweighted AND 4.0 weighted GPA
- 5 teacher recommendations
- No incidents of academic dishonesty
- A substantial number of community service hours (outside of school and not all related to club activities) [The specific

number is not released to avoid fraudulent applications.]

- Consistent involvement in a variety of extra-curricular activities [Again, the specific number is not released to avoid fraudulent applications.]

Applications for qualified candidates are distributed via email to students in Quarter 4. Induction is held in late April/early May.

ACT School Day

Who: Seniors who have not yet met the ELA and/or algebra EOC graduation requirement
Students will be automatically signed up to test at no cost to the student.

Test date: Tuesday, October 29, 7:45 AM

PSAT

Who: All 10th grade students are automatically signed up to test at no cost to the student.

Who: 11th Grade Students may elect to take the test to qualify for the national merit scholarships. Students must sign up to test period the cost is \$18.00, check payable to Riverview high school due at registration. If you're a student has not yet signed up, they should see Ms. Verdoni, or scan the QR found in guidance.

Who: Seniors attempting to use the math subject of the P SAT to meet their algebra EOC graduation requirement students will be automatically signed up to test at no cost to the student. This year the test will be administered digitally.

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10 THINGS YOU CAN DO NOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED IN HIGH SCHOOL

1. Make sure your phone number and home address are up to date with the registrar. Inaccurate information makes it difficult to contact family members.
2. Sign up for the Parent Portal- your chance to view your student's real- time attendance and updated grades. Go to www.sarasotacountyschools.net, click on parents and then click on Family Access Portal.
3. Attendance! Attendance and school success are directly related; use the Parent Portal to monitor your student's daily attendance. Make sure absentee notes are turned in right away. If you are getting an automated attendance phone call, your student has missed a class!
4. Using your student's schedule, email their teachers and counselor to introduce yourself and establish email communication.
5. Be proactive- Sarasota Co. Schools is going paperless. Please keep up with crosspointe to monitor your child's grades. The end of the marking periods for 2024-25 are:
 - a. End of quarter one- October 17
 - b. End of quarter two- December 20
 - c. End of quarter three- March 13
 - d. End of quarter four- May 28
6. Graduation requirements are outlined for each class in the Program of Studies located under the 'Website Menu', then click on Academics on the RHS website.
7. Keep a copy of all of the fact sheets from each of your student's teachers. These outline their grading system and expectations for each class.
8. Create a file folder at home to keep report cards and other school related information in one place.
9. Be familiar with the Bright Futures Scholarship. It changes from year to year. This is your student's opportunity to earn money for college and should always be a goal.
10. Visit www.sarasotacountyschools.net/schools/riverview for current news and information about RHS- know what's going on.

Bonus If you are in doubt, ask!

Be involved, double check the information coming home to you from your student!

GUIDANCE NEWS

Students and Parents can access grades and attendance on FOCUS. We encourage a weekly check in and if students are struggling in any of their classes, they can access the following supports:

- All Teachers have office hours at least twice a week from 7:15 – 7:40 (check with teacher to determine which days).
- School Counselors have office hours each morning from 7:15 – 7:40. Students can make an appointment by scanning a QR code (found in classrooms and throughout campus) or can come to a Guidance Suite or can email their school counselor.
- National Honor Society (NHS) students provide free tutoring to students in most every subject. Students can scan a QR code to be paired with a peer tutor. The QR codes can be found posted in classrooms, throughout school and in the School Counseling suites.
- The Math Department offers Ramp It Up tutoring help on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school from 2:30 – 3:30 (permission slips are available outside the classroom in 5-335 and parent signatures are required for participation).

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10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Seniors! Apply now for the Bright Futures Scholarship at: www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org. Create an account and complete the application. This can be done before community service hours, GPA and SAT/ACT requirements have been met.
2. Create your FSA ID <https://fsaid.ed.gov/> then complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.gov.
3. Search for local and updated scholarship information on www.LaunchYourPlan.com, in the Student Success Center, and <https://www.fastweb.com/> for national scholarship searches.
4. Check with the colleges you apply to for internal scholarships. Many of these require a separate application from your admissions application.
5. Check with the companies where you or your parents work and any other affiliated organizations. There are many scholarship opportunities available beyond the ones mentioned!
6. Organize Scholarship applications by due date.
7. Plan ahead for recommendation letters! Counselors require 10 business days to write letters of recommendation. Don't forget to provide your counselor with a resume of your activities while in high school. Pro tip – be sure to follow up with a thank you letter once your recommendation letter is completed!
8. Order copies of your transcript with the registrar at least a week before they need to be submitted with your scholarship applications. Transcript request forms are located in the Attendance Office and in Guidance.
9. Review your Essay. Highlight your accomplishments, goals and note relevant obstacles.
10. Follow the guidelines of the scholarship! It is important to submit a well organized and complete application.

IB CAREER PROGRAM

Is your student interested in obtaining an IB education catered to their career interest? IBCP is the perfect place for them! If you want to learn more about our program, check out our pathways, hear alumni statements, or watch an informational video, head over to our website (riverviewibcp.com). We will be accepting applications for the class of 2027 starting on December 2nd, 2024. The application window will remain open until February 3rd, 2024. Applications can be found on our website as well as posted as a QR code on Mrs. Bies classroom door, 5-324.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

A completed application form must be submitted and approved prior to starting volunteer hours (sarasotacountyschools.net, Students & Parents, High School Community Service). Hours completed without an approved community service log sheet will not be accepted. The high school community service logs (30+ documented hours) can be turned in during all lunch periods (Monday-Friday) to the Student Success Center (6-204).

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ACADEMIC GRADING IN HIGH SCHOOL

Academic Grade: The grades reflecting achievement in academic courses in grades 9-12 with numerical equivalents shall be:

Students receiving a grade for incomplete work (I) are to satisfy course requirements within ten days of the last day of the previous grading period. The principal may extend the time requirement for extreme hardships. For courses with a state required End of Course examination (EOC), the EOC is 30% of the final grade.

Employability Skills - For each course taken in high school, twenty percent (20%) of the quarter grade shall be based on the development of employability skills. Those skills will include:

- Attendance
- Coming to school or class on time
- Bringing required work tools, such as paper, pen/pencil, textbooks, notebooks, etc.
- Maintenance of an assignment notebook or similar system
- Completion of homework
- Appropriate dress for class
- Attitude of cooperation with teacher and fellow students
- Time in class devoted to the appropriate task
