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HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

STANDARD DIPLOMA

- To graduate from high school in 2020, a student must meet the following requirements:
- A student must earn the following credits: 26 and successfully complete all required courses (or equivalent)
 - Students must achieve a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale on all courses except for those courses forgiven according to the district forgiveness procedure.
 - A student must earn passing scores on the 10th grade FSA ELA in reading. Students are also required to pass the Alg. 1 EOC.

CENTER

- A certificate of completion will be awarded to students who: (1) have met all course, credit and GPA requirements, but have not passed one or both sections of the appropriate state tests required for graduation or (2) have passed both sections of the appropriate state tests required for graduation and met all course and credit requirements, but have not met the GPA requirement. Students receiving a certificate of completion may participate in the graduation ceremonies. These students may still pursue a standard diploma through adult education, the GED, or other suitable alternatives.
- Participation in two seasons of an interscholastic sport at the JV or Varsity level will waive the HOPE requirement. See school counselor for forms.
- Completion of two full years of the ROTC program will waive participation in the HOPE class and will waive the performing art requirement.
- Detailed information on graduation requirements and non-standard diploma options are available on the RHS website in the Program of Studies and on the district website in the guidance reference manual, Pathways, at www. sarasotacountyschools.net.
- 5. One course must be successfully completed online through SVA or FLVS. This course can be for .5 or 1.0 credit
- Students should schedule an appointment to meet with their school counselor to verify graduation status.

10 Things you can do Now to Help Your Child Succeed in High School

- 1. Make sure your phone number and home address are up to date with the registrar. Inaccurate information makes it difficult to contact family members.
- 2. Sign up for the Parent Portal- your chance to view your student's real- time attendance and updated grades. Go to www.sarasotacountyschools.net, click on parents and then click on Family Access Portal.
- 3. Attendance! Attendance and school success are directly related; use the Parent Portal to monitor your student's daily attendance. Make sure absentee notes are turned in right away. If you are getting an automated attendance phone call, your student has missed a class!
- 4. Using your student's schedule, email their teachers and counselor to introduce yourself and establish email communication.
- 5. Be proactive- Sarasota Co. Schools is going paperless. Please keep up with crosspointe to monitor your child's grades. The end of the marking periods for 2017-18 are:
 - a. End of quarter one- October 11th
 - b. End of quarter two- December 20th
 - c. End of quarter three- March 11th
 - d. End of quarter four- May 29th
- 6. Graduation requirements are outlined for each class in the Program of Studies located under the 'Website Menu', then click on Academics on the RHS website.
- 7. Keep a copy of all of the fact sheets from each of your student's teachers. These outline their grading system and expectations for each class.
- 8. Create a file folder at home to keep report cards and other school related information in one place.
- 9. Be familiar with the Bright Futures Scholarship. It changes from year to year. This is your student's opportunity to earn money for college and should always be a goal.
- 10. Visit www.sarasotacountyschools.net/schools/riverview for current news and information about RHS- know what's going on. *Bonus* If you are in doubt, ask!

Be involved, double check the information coming home to you from your student!

DIPLOMA/CERTIIFICATE OF COMPLETIONS PICKUP

Diploma or Certificate of Competitions will be available at Riverview High School beginning Tuesday, July 16 through Thursday, July 18th from 10 AM to 12 NOON in the Reception Office. Only you or your parent/guardian may pick up your diploma and a picture ID is required. **Participation in the walking ceremony does not guarantee that all requirements have been met for graduation.

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10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1. Seniors! Apply now for the Bright Futures Scholarship at: www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org. Create an account and complete the application. This can be done before community service hours, GPA and SAT/ACT requirements have been met.
- 2. Create your FSA ID https://fsaid.ed.gov/ then complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.gov.
- 3. Search for local and updated scholarship information on www.LaunchYourPlan.com, in the Student Success Center, and https://www.fastweb.com/ for national scholarship searches.
- 4. Check with the colleges you apply to for internal scholarships. Many of these require a separate application from your admissions application.
- 5. Check with the companies where you or your parents work and any other affiliated organizations. There are many scholarship opportunities available beyond the ones mentioned!
- 6. Organize Scholarship applications by due date.
- 7. Plan ahead for recommendation letters! Counselors require 10 business days to write letters of recommendation. Don't forget to provide your counselor with a resume of your activities while in high school. Pro tip be sure to follow up with a thank you letter once your recommendation letter is completed!
- 8. Order copies of your transcript with the registrar at least a week before they need to be submitted with your scholarship applications. Transcript request forms are located in the Attendance Office and in Guidance.
- 9. Review your Essay. Highlight your accomplishments, goals and note relevant obstacles.
- 10. Follow the guidelines of the scholarship! It is important to submit a well organized and complete application.

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RIVERVIEW HIGH SCHOOL HAS A NEW CAREER PATHWAY!

A new collaboration in Art and Computer Technology is in its first year at Riverview. Commercial Art and Design is a three-year program that provides experience in graphic design through hands-on projects. Ms. Justiniano will be teaching these courses. She has a uniquely suited working with students in this pathway. She has worked with Bealls as an Art Director, a Senior Graphic Designer and has a degree in Digital Media. Under her guidance, students will attain three separate industry certifications in Adobe Creative Suite programs as well as a brand-new Adobe Certified Associate Visual Design Specialist certification. There are three ACA certifications required:

- Graphic Design & Illustration using Adobe Illustrator
- Visual Communication using Adobe Photoshop
- Print & Digital Media Publication using Adobe InDesign

What Is Commercial Art?

This type of art applies artistic principles to a variety of fields. What is a commercial artist? Their work is used to sell, promote, explain, narrate, and inform. They may design media such as advertisements, logos, billboards, brochures, book covers, or product packaging. Commercial artists are typically employed by advertising agencies, newspapers, magazines, graphic design firms, television studios, and similar businesses.

Commercial art courses are commonly available through associate degree programs offered by two-year community colleges. Students in an associate degree program can expect to complete courses in topics such as commercial and advertising art, illustration, color theory, drawing, graphic design, typography, multimedia design, commercial art technology, and photography. **These are the same topics we will be covering in class.** Students will have FREE access to the entire suite of Adobe Creative Cloud products that we use in class.

Students interested in commercial art careers might also want to participate in internships to improve their professional skills and develop their portfolio. This collection of work showcases commercial artists' skills to potential employers, and it can be essential to starting a commercial arts career.

Riverview has the only Commercial Art and Design program in the county. This program can be taken by any student but as of next year, can also be taken as a part of the IBCP as one of the Career Pathways.



NOT YOUR OLD APEX

The Performance-Based Program (PBP) at Riverview High School is an alternative education program designed to assist students with their high school diploma through computer-assisted instruction, classroom instruction, and mentoring activities. The APEX resource is an alternative opportunity to earn or recover credits needed for graduation. APEX Learning Courses are online courses for both Regular Instruction and Credit Recovery courses needed to earn a Standard High School Diploma. The core instructional design of APEX is centered on Standards-based content accessible to all learners. APEX allows students to personalize their learning path and work at their own pace based on timelines coordinated with the Teacher of Record or Program Coordinator. APEX presents academic material in a variety of methods and gives students multiple opportunities to demonstrate success. APEX provides scaffolded support to meet student needs at their academic level. The Instructional Team members are veteran content experts committed to supporting the at-risk learners who are invited to apply to be a part of the PBP.

Last year 1067 semester courses were completed by 235 unique students affording 149 students the credits needed to graduate as a part of 2019 cohort. This year, over 150 students have active courses and will continue to seek a pathway to their high school diploma. The PBP is only available to select students at risk of not meeting graduation requirements. More information is available from Administration, School Counselors or the Program Coordinator, Dr. Joe Bazenas.
