

As we get closer to the end of the first semester, we also get closer to midterm exams. A calendar of the exams is listed in the newsletter. Exams can be a stressful time for students and it is important to do your best. Below are some study tips:

# \*Prep, Prep, Prep

The studying process can be less if notes are completed ahead of time. Preparation is the most effective way to reduce a student's anxiety and the most effective way to ensure success.

## \*Old is Gold

Many students throw out their tests and do not realize how much of an old tests can be. Teachers build their exams around the most important concepts of the semester and teacher are very likely to reuse important questions from their chapter tests.

## \*Visualize This

Many find that the best way to learn is through visual aids.

## \*Rest up

Getting enough sleep is important for the mind. Please be mindful of when exams take place & get a good night's sleep.

#### \*On time and full

Being on time makes exams less stressful. Take advantage of the free breakfast and fuel up before going to class.

#### **Attendance:**

With exams being so close to the holidays, it is extremely important to make sure your child is present for exams. Students who know ahead of time that they will not be present for exams will need to meet with their teacher and discuss when a make-up exam will take place. A student will receive a zero as a grade until the exam is made up. It is in the child's best interest to take the exam during the exam time while the information is still fresh.

## **Check out:**

During exams, student may check after their last exam of the day. Students will receive a color-coded checkout form from their teachers prior to the exam. The checkout form must be signed by a parent (there is a different form for each exam day). The student will give the signed checkout form to their last exam teacher of the day. Student must remain in the exam for 1 hour. After the hour and after students have completed their exam, they may be excused if they turned the form in. Students must leave campus immediately after they are excused. We will not accept parent phone checkouts during exam days.

Good luck to all the students in the next couple of months. Please take advantage of this time to prepare and make the most of each class day!

# Mr. Quinlan's Corner

Our school year has gotten off to a great start. I would like to take this opportunity to clarify a few of our policies and procedures at Rockledge High School. New this year, implemented in order to promote increased campus safety while also working to ensure students are able maximized their time within their classes, Rockledge High implemented the **10 Minute Rule**. Simply stated, this policy does not allow students to leave their classrooms during the first and last 10 minutes of the class period.

**Tardies:** At Rockledge High School, students are expected to be on time to each class. Students can be tardy to class twice per semester without penalty. Starting with the third tardy, students will be required to serve an afterschool detention.

Attendance: We are asking all of our parents to increase communication with us when your child will be absent from school. Additionally, when your child returns to school from being absent, please provide documentation of doctor's appointments, religious holidays, required court appearances or death in the family to our attendance clerk. These types of absences will be excused. Any unexcused absences beyond nine days, your child will be in jeopardy of failing their semester classes due to lack of regular school attendance. Furthermore, five unexcused absences in a grading period or 15 absences within a 90-day period may result in a referral for truancy, which can affect students from obtaining or keeping a driver's license. When returning from an absence, please remind your student to contact each teachers for their make-up work.

**Teamwork:** We want to ensure every student has the best high school experience possible. As we work towards that goal, if there are issues, questions, or concerns regarding your student or anything we are doing or not doing here at Rockledge High School, please let us know. Give us a call or stop in and see us.

# **District Administrative Procedures For Grading**

In accordance with School Board Policies 5420, Reporting Student Progress, and 5421, Grading, the following procedures shall be implemented in order to establish suitable uniform methods for marking and reporting progress of students to their parents. Schools utilizing alternative scheduling need to ensure that their procedures are aligned with those outlined below. For example, a semester at a typical school equals a quarter at a block school, and procedures should be implemented accordingly.

- 1. Grades shall be a measure of a student's progress and achievement in mastering the standards of the course based on the quality of work done and reflect a comprehensive evaluation which utilizes numerous & varied assessments.
- 2. Letter grades shall be issued each marking period based on the following numerical values as established by s.1003.437, F.S. (s.232.2463, F.S.):

A = 90 - 100

B = 80 - 89

C = 70 - 79

D = 60 - 69

F = 0 - 59

# 3. Semester Examinations

Formal, comprehensive semester examinations shall be required at the end of the first semester & for courses other than those described in the next paragraph for the second semester. The principal may approve an alternative assessment in lieu of a formal, written, comprehensive semester examination for justifiable academic reasons in a course where such an assessment might not be appropriate. A student's semester examination will be made available by the teacher/principal for at least two weeks following the examination and shall be available for parent/ student perusal at the school.



Second semester examinations will be administered except in courses connected to FSA, FCAT, State EOC, AP, IB, AICE, or Industry Certification assessments. However, teachers are to utilize the time after those assessments are administered until the last day of school (including shortened exam days) to further teach & assess performance standards of the course & include their on-going class assessments within the 4th grading period average. The second semester average for these courses is determined by the averaging the 3rd & 4th nine-week grading periods.

English 4, English 4 Honors and English 4: Florida College Prep classes will administer the Brevard Public Schools Final Examination (BPSFE) as the 2nd semester examination. Teachers of these courses will set the scores to determine grades students earn from this examination.

4. Calculation of the Semester Average when including a semester (final) examination

The average for each of the two nine-week grading periods is weighted 40% and semester examination is weighted 20%. (i.e. 40/40/20) In performing the semester average calculations, teachers may utilize the numerical value of each grading period and the semester examination or they may use the letter grade with the following values assigned:

 $\mathbf{A} = 4$  points;  $\mathbf{B} = 3$  points;  $\mathbf{C} = 2$  points;  $\mathbf{D} = 1$  point;  $\mathbf{F} = 0$  points

If the numerical value for each marking period is used in calculating the semester average, no grade below a 39 shall be used as the nine-week average. The semester examination grade will be included at its earned value. Grade averaging procedures must be consistent in a given school as approved by the principal.

If letter grades are used to calculate the semester average, the average shall be at least 0.50 in order to receive a passing grade/credit, unless a passing grade is justified by a numerical average. Rounding up shall be used in mathematical calculations in accordance with the following conversion chart:

3.50 - 4.00 = A; 2.50 - 3.49 = B; 1.50 - 2.49 = C; 0.50 - 1.49 = D; 0.00 - 0.49 = F

If a student's performance on the semester (final) examination is higher than his/her performance throughout the semester, the teacher may issue the student one letter grade higher for the semester average than the mathematical calculations would typically provide. Such a decision should be made on actual academic performance considerations.

5. Once recorded, grades other than an "Incomplete," will not be changed without approval of the principal. A principal may change a grade for justifiable academic reason.

- Don't assume you won't qualify for need-based financial assistance. Apply even if you think you won't qualify. Students who receive financial assistance come from a wide variety of family income levels since many factors effect eligibility.
- Make sure you know about all the deadlines. Deadlines vary from school to school and program to program, and are very rarely extended!
- Make copies or notes about all documents you send; record when and to whom.
