Adult and Community Education Classes

Who is eligible for Adult Education classes?

Adult Education Students must be:

- Age 16 years or older
- Officially withdrawn from K-12
 - Bring a copy of the withdrawal form if under 18 years old

How do I register in person?

- Visit an Adult Ed School Site near you
- Fill out the registration form
- Pay the tuition fee of \$30 (\$5 badge fee may apply)
- Take an assessment to find the class that is right for you.

The registration process varies by school site. Contact the school that you would like to attend for more information.

How do I register online?

- Select the school that you would like to attend below.
- Click the link to complete the registration form.
- Click on your class to create your account and pay for the class.

Note: Payment can be made using a credit, debit, prepaid, or gift card. There is a \$1.39 processing fee. You will need to verify your email address when creating your account. See the videos below for instructions.

Here Comes the Bus

Here Comes The Bus is an easy-to-use website and application that enables you to see the location of your child's school bus on a smartphone, tablet, or personal computer. You will be able to know when the bus is near your stop, so you can send your child out at just the right time.

You and your children can access all the information about the buses you need using just one "Here Comes the Bus" account. "Here Comes the Bus" uses HTTPS, just like a bank or online store, which means that all communications between your web browser and the site is encrypted and secure. (That's what the S in "HTTPS" stands for — secure.) The Here Comes the Bus website is available in Spanish and French, in addition to English. If your computer is already set to display one of these languages, the website will automatically use the same language. Otherwise, you can change the language by clicking the current language (such as English) at the top right of the web page. A student's location is not being tracked by the application. Here Comes the Bus" is available at no cost to all families.

School District Palm Beach County Summer Internships


Welcome!

Fun Activities that Prevent the Summer Slide Summer Parenting Tips that Help Support Learning and Prevent Summer Slide

Children often relish those school-free summer months. Time away from the classroom, however, often leads to the "summer slide," or the loss of academic skills. When kids are not engaged in scholastic activities, they can regress and forget what they learned the previous year.

These summer parenting tips about such activities can help kids of a wide range of ages and learning differences. It is often as simple as incorporating learning into day-to-day life.

Spend Time in the Kitchen

Cooking is old hat for many parents, but it is a new educational experience for kids. Integrate children into the cooking process by measuring ingredients, reading recipes, watching the stove timer or dividing up portions for dinner. This reinforces math and reading skills without making children feel frustrated or intimidated.

Explore the Outdoors

"Green-thumb" parents can ask children to help plant a garden. Kids learn where flowers and food come from and how they grow with care and nurturing. Time with nature is great for children; families can pitch a tent in the backyard if they don't have time to go camping. Exploring the trees, critters and soil on local trails and in parks enhances kids' appreciation of the earth.

Play Games and Do Crafts

Flash card games, like math war or concentration, help with computation and memory skills. Just a few minutes a day feel like play time and give kids the esteem boost of a solved problem. Families can play cards or have a regular board game night to enhance strategy and problem-solving skills. A daily craft activity promotes dexterity and language skills. Kids who like comics can write their own with original text and pictures.

Read Everything, Everywhere

Kids engage with words every moment of the day. They should read cereal boxes, menus, recipes and signs as they go about their summer activities. Reading aloud to kids before bed and supporting their solitary time with books help improve reading fluency and enjoyment. A family blog gets kids interested in writing. Kids may create a scrapbook of summer activities with printed pictures and pages they can flip through.

Take a Field Trip

Whether it is going to a baseball game, a museum or the local park, kids learn when they are engaged in an activity. Parents can discuss strategy at the game and talk about kids' favorite parts of museum exhibits. A walk to the park is an opportunity to talk about the neighborhood and its history, using language and analytical skills.

Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Highlights Summer BreakSpot Program

To help ensure that Florida children have access to wholesome meals during summer break, the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services partners with schools and organizations to provide free meals to kids and teens from low-income areas. The Summer BreakSpot Program provides meals at no cost to children 18 and under, while schools are closed for the summer. There are several ways to find a Summer BreakSpot site:

Summer BreakSpot sites include open sites and camps (residential and non-residential.) Open sites are sites where meals are available to all children in the area on a first-come, first-served basis. Acceptance and participation requirements for the program are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability.

Summer BreakSpot is part of the National Summer Food Service Program, a federally funded program operated by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA.) For more information, please visit: SummerBreakSpot.org.

Mental Health & Well-Being

Mental health is our ability to live fully, engage with others, and respond to challenges. Youth mental health can be understood as how they (children and adolescents):

- relate to others through social interactions and relationships,
- feel and experience emotions, and
- act and behave in different settings.

Like physical health, mental health exists on a continuum. A person may have times where they experience strong/positive mental health and well-being. Other times, the same person may experience challenges to their mental health and well-being. Mentally healthy students are more likely to go to school ready to learn, actively engage in school activities, have supportive and caring connections with adults and young people, use appropriate problem-solving skills, use positive behaviors, and add to positive school culture.

Mental health and well-being connect to resiliency (the ability to bounce back after tough times) and is important at every stage of life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood. Any parent, guardian or caregiver with concerns about the social, emotional or behavioral well-being of their child should contact their child's school.

The School District of Palm Beach County's SLL Framework is based upon required Health Instruction as outlined in Florida State Statute 1003.42(n)(4) and involves acquiring and effectively applying knowledge, attitudes, and skills of self-awareness and self-management, responsible decision-making, resiliency, relationship skills (including conflict resolution), and social awareness (including understanding and respecting other viewpoints and backgrounds).

- Click Create an Account (You only need ONE account, even if you have children in more than one high school and/or junior high; Do Not create another account if you have used Register My Athlete in the past)
- Fill in personal account information (this should be the Parent's personal information)
- You will be using the site as a Parent
- Click Submit

After you have an account:

- Login
- Under the Parents header (Blue), Click the button labeled "Click here to start/complete athlete registrations". (the first time you log in you will be asked to agree to terms and conditions)
- Click Start/Complete a Registration (upper left hand corner of the page)
- Click Start a New Registration this is where you will enter all of your Athlete's information
- Click on the red bars to complete all requirements
- Click the orange button on the lower left side of the screen for live chat or email support@aktivate.com for assistance
