

FREE: Paper 24/7 Tutoring Access for Students

The School District of Palm Beach County has partnered with Paper to provide unlimited access to trained tutors so every student can ask questions, work through problems, and grow their confidence—at no cost to families.

Paper is an online, on-demand tutoring service that provides students with unlimited, 24/7 academic support. Whether they're stuck on homework, studying for a test, or need someone to read and make suggestions for their writing, there will always be experts available online to assist students one-on-one in <u>all subject areas</u> and in more than 4 languages. <u>Paper tutors</u> have been specially trained to conduct expert, academic support in a secure, chat-based platform. With a commitment to helping students learn, they'll never give students answers, but rather facilitate deeper learning by asking guiding questions and providing timely encouragement.

Live chat: Students have 24/7 unlimited access to high-quality individualized tutoring via chat. When students hit a stumbling block on an assignment, they can connect with a tutor in under a minute and ask any academic question, any time across all subjects and in multiple languages. Students simply type in their question, upload a file or draw out the problem on the whiteboard.

Writing feedback: Students can receive feedback on their writing assignments to strengthen their writing skills. They can upload any type of written work to receive revisions from tutors within 24 hours. During the revision process, tutors highlight areas the student can improve and explain why, focusing on writing elements such as content, organization, citations and grammar.

Attendance

- Chronic absenteeism means missing 10% (about 18 days) or more of school days in a year.
- Missing 10% of school days can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Students who are chronically absent are less likely to succeed academically and more likely to drop out of school.

Missing 2 days of school per month from Kindergarten - 12th Grade

- = 108 hours per year
- = 11 months
- = over 1 school year lost

Parents and Families Should:

- 1. Make getting to school on time everyday a high priority in your family.
- Talk with your child about the importance of school attendance from an early age and the negative effects of too many absences.
- When necessary, create a safe space for your child to share what's keeping them from participating in school on a regular basis.
- 4. Have a back-up plan for getting your child to school when there are difficulties with transportation, family illness, or other challenges.
- 5. Schedule doctor and other appointments for after school hours whenever possible.
- 6. Monitor students' school attendance to make sure your child is in class every day.
- 7. Contact your child's school to discuss supports and services that can help your child maintain regular school attendance.

What is Mental Health?

Mental health includes our emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It affects how we think, feel, and act. It also helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others, and make choices. Mental health is important at every stage of life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood.

We take care of our physical health by learning the importance of diet and nutrition, sleep habits and physical exercise. Maintaining good mental health is just as important. Learning strategies to cope with life's challenges, decrease stress, and increase mindfulness are ways to help maintain mental health.

Prevention works. Promoting the social-emotional wellbeing of children and youth leads to:

- Higher overall productivity.
- Better educational outcomes.
- Lower crime rates.
- Stronger economies.
- Lower health care costs.
- Improved quality of life.
- Increased lifespan.
- Improved family life.

Over the course of your life, if you experience mental health problems, your thinking, mood, and behavior could be affected. Many factors contribute to mental health problems, including:

- Biological factors, such as genes or brain chemistry.
- Life experiences, such as trauma or abuse.
- Family history of mental health problems.

Mental health problems are common but help is available.

Friends and loved ones can make a big difference. Only 44% of adults with diagnosable mental health problems and less than 20% of children and adolescents receive needed treatment. Friends and family can be important influences to help someone get the treatment and services they need by:

- Reaching out and letting them know you are available to help.
- Helping them access mental health services.
- Learning and sharing the facts about mental health, especially if you hear something that isn't true.
- Treating them with respect, just as you would anyone else.

All of the district school campuses have mental health professionals that can assist. Please reach out to a School Counselor, School Psychologist, or School Behavioral Health Professional at your nearby school. They can connect you to school and community resources.

Additionally, parents can locate their assigned bus route and get directions using a Google Map that shows all of the District schools.




