TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Bob Perkins was named Sarasota High School's *Teacher of the Year* for 2019-2020. Mr. Perkins received his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from the University of Florida and began his teaching career 29 years ago as a full-time substitute at Buchholz High in Gainesville, Florida. He taught at several different high schools before coming



to Sarasota High in 1995. While working towards his degree at the University of Florida, he was required to complete volunteer work in the Athletic Training field for his specialization in Athletic Training. On his first day volunteering at Gainesville High, he was offered a position to coach defensive backs by then Head Coach, Gunnar Paulsen. During that season, Mr. Perkins found his passion for working with students and athletes and believed that he could help them be successful in their academics.

Mr. Perkins was impacted by two educators who inspired him to become a teacher. The first individual was Dr. Owen Holyoak, a professor at the University of Florida and the other one was Rick Swain, an Art teacher and Head Basketball Coach at Buchholz High. While teaching at Sarasota High, Mr. Perkins has been an ESE

teacher and a drop-out prevention Math teacher. He has taught in the Anchor Program at Sarasota High for 17 years, serving the last nine years as the program's coordinator. The Anchor Program is a drop-out prevention program for students that may be struggling to complete their academic credits for graduation.

During his time as a Sailor, Mr. Perkins not only impacted students inside the classroom but also on the field, the court and the track. He coached many different sports including, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Track & Field and Weightlifting. The late Eddie Howell first hired him in 1995 to coach Freshman Football. He coached Sailor football for 15 years and was Head Coach for 9 years.

Custodian Don Pointer was selected by the faculty and staff as this year's *School Related Employee of the Year*. Mr. Pointer has been a custodian at Sarasota High for 29 ½ years. 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CLYDE METCALF INDUCTED TO FHSAA HALL OF FAME

Sarasota High School baseball coach Clyde Metcalf was inducted to the Florida High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame on September 22, 2019.

Metcalf was born in Sarasota and returned to his high school alma mater in 1981 to serve as the head baseball coach. Coach Metcalf has won two national championships (1989, 1994) and six state championships (1987, 1989, 1993, 1994, 1996, 2007) in 38 seasons. He has 909 career wins and has guided the Sailors to an astounding 14 appearances in the FHSAA Final Four. Coach Metcalf has had more than 200 of his athletes play college baseball, 70 play professional baseball and 14 make it to Major League Baseball.

Away from the diamond, Metcalf was also the athletic director for SHS for 22 years and even served as the assistant coach on the football team from 1981 to 2001. Coach Metcalf's accomplishments on the diamond are extremely impressive and his impact on Sarasota High School is immeasurable.

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




AICE SCHOLAR AWARDS




