Our MaST program hosted its Annual Senior Symposium in April. Thirty-three seniors presented their advanced research in a thesis defense style format as a capstone requirement for the MaST program. This was the highest number ever of MaST Symposium presenters. In order to graduate as a MaST Research Scholar, a student must complete four credits in research, earn four credits each in honors or advanced mathematics and science, must maintain a 3.5 weighted GPA, attend the regional science fair, and participate in the MaST Symposium all four years.

The *STRIVE* Awards were born out of H. Jack Hunkele's vision to recognize students who have overcome tremendous challenges to succeed in life. Thanks to the H. Jack Hunkele Charitable Foundation and other generous donors, the Education Foundation of Sarasota County, in partnership with Sarasota County Schools, annually highlights the resilience and grit of students across our county.

The annual *STRIVE* Award Celebration honors juniors and seniors in the Sarasota County Schools' seven comprehensive high schools. Teachers, counselors, and principals nominate five seniors and five juniors from each school. Seniors receive \$1,000 each to award their accomplishment and juniors receive a \$100 gift card. *STRIVE* Award recipients are honored each spring at award ceremonies and receive cash gifts for education after high school. They are connected to Education Foundation resources such as student success coaching, mentoring, and workshops. They are also invited to serve as student leaders promoting resilience and persistence.


WE ARE S-A-I-L-O-R-S

Nearly 2,500 students fill the Sarasota High campus daily. It is here where 195 faculty, 40 support staff and the 2,500 member student body create the Sailor family. This is also where we accomplish great things, both on our campus and in the Sarasota community and beyond.

Sailors showed this year that they can win debates, be named tournament champions and qualify for one or both national championships for the 22nd year in a row. They can receive top awards at science fairs and competitions and win two spots at the Regeneron International Science and Engineering Fair. Sailor athletes won athletic scholarships, signed national letters of intent, won a district championship and a state championship. The JROTC Color Guard proudly opened athletic events and paved the way as we saluted and honored veterans on Veterans Day. The full JROTC battalion marched in the city of Sarasota's annual Veterans Day parade. The Mighty Sailor Band was also seen marching down Main Street on Veterans Day clad in their prestigious sailor uniforms.

Sailor AICE students showed how to ace a test by earning Cambridge Scholar Awards and AICE diplomas. AICE diplomas were earned by 182 seniors this year, the most diplomas ever for the AICE program. Sailor cheerleaders cheered their way into our hearts with enthusiasm and school spirit as their voices echoed through Cleland Stadium, the Edward F. Howell Gymnasium and across the SHS campus. Sailor thespians danced and sang their way across the stage in the musical *Mamma Mia*. OH, THE PLACES YOU'LL GO!

As this newsletter goes to print, there will be approximately four days of school remaining for the Class of 2023. A few days after their time in the classroom draws to a close, seniors will walk across the stage, receive their high school diploma and begin a new chapter in their lives. Some will enter the full-time work force, some will enter trade or vocational school, some will join the U.S. Armed Forces. Some will step right into a summer semester of college while others will start in the fall.

The Student and Success Center has been abuzz this spring. College and Career Advisors have been working diligently with seniors with a high number of college acceptances and scholarships. We have a number of "firsts" at Sarasota High this year, including a record number of first-generation students attending college.

State College of Florida has accepted over 150 seniors this year. Affordability, special programs and small class size made SCF a popular choice. State College of Florida also appealed to those students unsure of what course of study they wanted to pursue. The University of Florida had a record 45 seniors accepted this year, including PACE program and summer admissions, and 44 seniors were accepted to Florida State University.

One hundred seniors from the Class of 2023 were accepted to the University of South Florida. Acceptances to Florida universities also included Florida Gulf Coast University, University of Central Florida, Florida Atlantic University and Florida International University. Out of state acceptances include Duke University, Johns Hopkins University, University of Southern California, New York University, Wake Forest University, Michigan State, Mississippi State University, Auburn University and Clemson University. Approximately 100 seniors were accepted to technical colleges.
