



# Computer Science

#### Here's what's happening in SMS Computer Science Classes:

During the second quarter, students in CS Discoveries & ICT 3 have been working on their coding skills using <u>Ozaria.com</u>. They have learned to write a story using the computer language called Python. To set the stage for their story, students first developed a game in chapter 1.

Students practiced problem solving, sequences, loops, syntax, & debugging. At the end of chapter 1, students created an interactive game to demonstrate mastery of algorithms, debugging, objects, methods, and loops.

In chapter 2, students have been working on algorithms, debugging logic errors, variables, & conditionals. Students then use variables and conditionals

to build an interactive story with characters and dialogue. Key concepts covered in both chapters:

- Sequences & Algorithms
- Syntax
- Debugging
- Variables
- Boolean Logic
- Conditionals

# School Nurse - IMPORTANT

Due to the recent "Parents' Bill of Rights", F. S. 1014.06 – Parental Consent for Health Care Services, parents must give written consent in order for their child

to access health care while at school. This consent will allow the school nurse to provide care and treatment to your child for injuries and illnesses, and when necessary, emergency health services performed until Emergency Medical Services arrive on campus. Should you decline

> consent for these services, you will be notified any time your student has such a need, and you will be responsible for arrangement of care outside of the school setting. This consent will remain in effect until your child transfers to another school district, graduates, or you indicate in writing that

you wish to rescind this consent for school health services.

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
