A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Greetings to all SRHS families,

We welcomed our students back on January 8th and have had a wonderful start to our second semester. On our third day back, we hosted guest speaker J.C. Phol of Teen Truth, who spoke with our students about bullying and violence prevention in schools. He emphasized the importance of standing up and speaking out so that our students have an active voice on our campus. We see to create a campus culture in which each student has at least one trusted staff member they can reach out to if they are encountering bullying or violence. Additionally, our school district has implemented a "see something, say something" policy, which we've shared with our students. They now have access to the brand new Fortify FL phone app, which allows them to quickly and easily alert school officials and law enforcement of any suspicious activity that could affect our campus. Parents, please talk with your child to ensure that the Fortify FL app is only used in case of an emergency. Our number one priority is to keep our campus safe and productive on a daily basis!



As a data-driven school, we actively monitor how our students are progressing behaviorally and academically. Please congratulate your child for doing their part in reducing office disciplinary referrals by 39%, maintaining our daily attendance rate above 90%, and receiving an 89% school district rating for the cleanliness of our campus! Our students and teachers have committed to making our school a better place by doing the keys things to ensure a positive school environment. We are fostering multiple initiatives to promote a positive climate on our campus, including the Self-Reflection Center, which is a behavior intervention program for all students, Restorative Justice, an after school group counseling program, and the Shark Waves Recognition program, which is a part of our Positive Behavior Intervention Support System. We also continue to offer academic support beyond the classroom setting through after school tutoring and our ALS program. New to our campus this year is our school-wide recycling program, aimed to keep our campus clean and positively impact the environment. We love seeing our students benefit from these programs on behavioral, academic, and social levels and hope to continue to see increased positive behavior and attitudes.

We would like to give a big congratulations to our band director Mr. Goldstein, for being one of five finalist for the Indian River County Teacher of the Year! Also, a great job to all student-athletes who were involved in our fall and winter sports clubs; they did a remarkable job demonstrating superior sportsmanship and teamwork in leading our teams to victory! YOUTH VAPING EPIDEMIC

The US Surgeon General issued a health advisory for a Youth Vaping epidemic in November 2018. Why should you be concerned? One out of every four (25%) high school students is vaping. This is the same percentage of youth who were smoking in 1999!



The marketing of electronic cigarettes and Juul are misleading people, especially children and youth to believe vaping is harmless water vapor. It is not water vapor. It is made of chemicals like propylene glycol and benzoic acid that create aerosol. They contain flavors that when heated create the same cancer-causing chemicals that are in cigarettes, and nearly all e-cigarettes contain nicotine. Vaping may be safer than cigarettes for adults, however safer does not equal safe for kids. Youth brains are still developing. Nicotine interferes with control of emotions and the ability to focus and learn. Is your student having trouble paying attention? Nicotine is as potentially addictive as cocaine and more addictive than morphine. Nicotine can also be a gateway drug for future substance abuse. Why are kids using Juul? Juul is cool and kids may say they are juuling, not vaping or smoking. Don't be fooled. Juul looks like a long flash drive and will recharge in a USB port. It's small, discreet and does not give off a foul odor or large cloud. Juul has .5mg of nicotine compared to .3mg in typical cigarettes. They are made for adult smokers, not kids who have never smoked before. Youth who have never used tobacco report feeling dizzy or sick as well as feeling buzzed from Juul. Have a talk with your child about scientific studies versus advertising. Science isn't making money off kids--electronic cigarette companies are.

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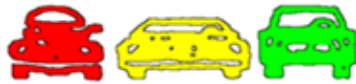

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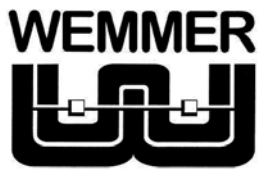

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NEWS FROM OUR JROTC UNIT

The Friday before Thanksgiving break when everyone was heading home and looking forward to the holiday and some time off, 6 JROTC cadets were taking a computer based exam at our unit. They all take the test together as a team.

Each year the College Options Foundation holds what they call the JROTC Leadership and Academic Bowl. It starts as a competition between each services JROTC units and culminates in a Championship in Washington

D.C. where JROTC units of all branches compete against each other.

This is not just a JROTC exam. As a matter of fact, the questions are based primarily on SAT/ACT material as well as current events and even financial literacy (see breakdown below):

- Level I exam includes 25% JROTC questions, 65% SAT/ACT-type questions, and 10% current events questions.
- Level II exam includes 15% JROTC questions, 75% SAT/ACT-type questions, and 10% current events questions.

One hundred ninety-six Navy JROTC teams competed in Level I. Ten schools from Florida have advanced to Level II and Sebastian River was 1 of those 10. For our size school we are 1 of 4 in the state to advance.

We are competing in a group of 44 schools from around the country and need to be in the top 4 to advance to the National Championship. We are currently scheduled to take the Level II exam the week of February 11th. Regardless of where we ultimately place, I am very proud of our cadets. They continue to represent Shark Nation and our district in fine fashion.

During the test, the questions are timed and the group must decide on an answer. I watched 6 students working together and laughing and having a good time. THAT is what makes this competition worth the time and effort.

Navy JROTC goes to great lengths to offer academic competitions like JLAB and Brain Brawls in order to show the value of education and also the value of competition. Just like other areas of competition, Florida is very competitive and we are proud to be in the mix this year.

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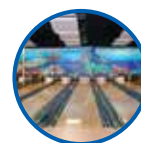
