CEL

CEL 1 students have just completed their career exploration unit by creating "professional skeletons" who are dressed for success! After thoroughly researching careers of interest and creating career comparison posters, they were tasked with taking their knowledge of workplace ethics and applying it to a career of their choice. They wrote about this on the backs of their skeletons and then they dressed them professionally for that career. They did an outstanding job! Some of our best dressed skeletons included Aubry Ralph's homicide detective, Ethan Spurgeon's pilot, Callie Fruit's marine biologist, Mariah Schwartz's artist, Eli Spearl's soccer player and Neil Trivitayakhun's actor as Phantom of the Opera!

CEL 2 students are currently studying school age development. They have been researching classroom behavior plans and are now working together to create utopian classrooms!

CEL 3 students are volunteering to tutor students in the AVID program and have also begun presenting HIP (Health Information Project) lessons to ninth grade students across campus. This nationally recognized program allows for peer health educators to make connections with and provide resources to ninth graders, teaching them about important topics like healthy eating habits and nutrition.



Our CEL 4 students are actively interning at 6 local elementary schools, 2 middle

schools and here on our SHS campus in reading classrooms. Our interns are conducting small group lessons, supporting social growth by being lunch buddies, tutoring one on one, planning, and delivering content and much more! They are also tasked with connecting this experience to the CEL standards each week. For example, when asked about the importance of grouping, CEL senior Maddie Russo wrote, "*it is clear that it is extremely important for teachers to use intentional grouping in a classroom in order to provide varied options for students to show mastery of content. This is saying that teachers do things intentionally. As an intern in a first-grade classroom at Oakhurst Elementary School, I have been able to see this firsthand. There is a method to the teacher's madness. As a student it is hard to see this sometimes, but through this interning program, I have been given the opportunity to appreciate this and see the behind the scenes of why teachers do the things that they do, their motives." These connections are vital to the CEL internship experience, and students are witnessing firsthand each day how the CEL standards are being put into action across Pinellas County Schools."*

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Warhawks Swim & Dive

Congratulations to the boys and girls of our swim & dive team for an amazing season!

Districts: Girls: Maya Golubovic placed 1st in the 50 and 100 freestyle. Boys: Jackson Healy placed 1st in the 50 freestyle and 100 butterfly; Tre Jones placed 1st in the 100 breaststroke; The Boys 200 freestyle relay team placed 1st: Jonny Herold, Liam Cavanaugh, Tre jones and Jackson Healy.

Regionals: Senior Maya Golubovic is the Regional Champ in both her events the 50 Free and 100 free. Sophomore Jackson Healy is the Regional Champ in the 50 Free. Tre Jones is the Regional Champ in the 100 Breaststroke.

States: The boys swim team placed 10th out of 45 teams at the State meet in Ocala and the highest ranked Pinellas County team: Jackson Healy placed 7th overall in the 50 free and 21st in the 100 Fly; Tre Jones Placed 3rd overall in the 100 breaststroke, and 16th in the 200 Free; Jonny Herold placed 22nd overall in the 50 free and 24th in the 100 free; Liam Cavanaugh placed 18th overall in the 100 breaststroke; Jonny Herold, Liam Cavanaugh, Tre Jones and Jackson Healy placed 8th overall in the 200-medley relay and 7th overall in the 200 free relay.

The girls swim team tied for 8th place out of 44 teams, and the 2nd highest ranked Pinellas County team: Victoria Teixeria Placed 9th overall in the diving event, all 11 of her dives were amazing, and her highest scoring dive was 2 forward somersaults, earning 43.9 points towards her final score of 345.25; Maya Golubovic placed 2nd overall in the 50 and 100 Freestyle; Alana Hauser placed 23rd overall in the 100 Free; Brooke Billitto placed 12th overall in the 200 IM and 22nd in the 100 Backstroke; Brooke Billitto, Alex Growe, Alana Hauser and Maya Golubovic placed 7th overall in the 200 free relay and 6th overall in the 400 free relay.

Warhawk Football kicked off to a great start for the 2023 Season, finishing at 4-5 which is the most wins in 20+ years! This season was full of excitement beginning in our weightroom and transferring to our practice field in preparation for some good old fashion smash mouth football. This year's group of young men was some of the toughest football players in the county. Their dedication to the entirety of the program proved that it's not the size of the dog in the fight, but the size of the fight that's in the dog! Our Warhawk football team is dedicated to the weightroom which is where the development of better athletes begins. At SHS, this strength training program is designed for each individual student-athlete, while programs are tailored to be sport and position specific, considering the movement and energy systems involved in football. The Strength & Conditioning program is evaluated and monitored continuously and adjusted when necessary to reach optimal gains. SHS student-athletes workout year-round with phases for in-season competition, pre-competition, post-competition, and off-season. In addition, our football program also has nutritional guidelines athletes follow to provide the necessary amount of nutrients needed for muscular growth including the athletes own snack bar area and refrigerator.
