Our Seminole Warhawk Marching Band is the 2022 Florida Marching Band Class 3A State Champions! On Sunday, November 20th in Miami, Florida, your Warhawks gave the performance of a lifetime against the top nineteen Class 3A marching bands in the entire state and emerged victorious. It was a windy, rainy day in South Florida, and the students did not flinch as they captured caption awards for best Percussion, Music, General Effect and the overall highest score: 93.35. This is Seminole's 5th state championship in the circuits 25 years (2006, 2011, 2012, and 2018) and our highest gold medal score in the school's history.

Other CEL seniors are making a huge difference in the lives of students at Bauder, Seminole Elementary, Anona, Seminole Middle and Osceola Middle where they are interning or mentoring every week. They are also participating in various leadership activities across our own campus, taking the lead as officers of HIP (the Health Information Project), Educators Rising and Leader in Me.

The CEL juniors are doing an amazing job delivering the HIP curriculum to groups of freshmen. Several CEL 3 and 4 students also volunteer weekly to assist in AVID classrooms on campus and at Seminole Middle.

The sophomores in CEL 2 are currently learning about Adolescent Development and how that affects learning in the middle and high school classroom. They are working in groups to create imaginary theme parks with rides and attractions that show their understanding of the different stages of development and the issues associated with them.

In CEL 1, students have just presented a research project on a great leader - living or dead - of their choice. Students had to write interview questions and research how that leader would have answered the questions based on available source material. They then presented the interview in either a live or recorded format. They are now looking forward to practicing mock job interviews in upcoming weeks

# Model Water Towers In The Capital





# Women In STEM

Our Women in STEM club is closing the gender gaps in STEM education and encouraging young women to pursue science, math, engineering, and technology subjects. The Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) has been tracking STEM major gender enrollment since 1994. In 1994, women made up 34% of students majoring in STEM fields, then up to 40% in 2010, and in 2020 women have made up 45%. Women have made great progress in the STEM areas throughout the years, yet enrolment in some fields still shows large gender inequalities: physics, computer science, economics, and engineering.

So far, our club has made glue from milk, used toothpicks and gummy bears to make a bridge, used Coulombic forces of attraction to make tinsel fly with PVC pipes, and so much more! We recently volunteered at the STEM Explorer Fest at Largo Central Park where we assisted all the vendors and made sure they had all the food, drinks, and supplies they needed.

Also, we volunteered at the PCSB Showcase at Hollins High School where Mr. Cantrell and Mrs. Vaughn were able to demonstrate the STEAM academy and the students were able to see all the programs and academies Seminole High School has to offer. We would like to expand into the community by planning a school-wide Q&A with local professionals in the STEM field. This will be open to all females interested in the STEM world. Students will be able to ask questions face to face and will be given opportunities for volunteering, camps, and jobs for the summer and beyond. Women in STEM is open to all females of any grade level and will continue into the next school year starting in early August. Our goals for this year are coding and 3-D printing! 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


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# Warhawk History Day
