Madison Leiner won the Senior Pinellas Water Prize at the Pinellas Regional Science and Engineering Fair. This award is provided to a High School student that places as the top student in PCS in water related research. Additionally, Madison took first place at the Pinellas Regional Science and Engineering Fair for her Environmental Science research and experimentation in methods to reduce red tide algal blooms. Madison placed number one of more than 100,000 students in public and private schools within Pinellas County. Madison's accomplishments allow her to progress to the Florida State Science and Engineering Fair. She will be among approximately 900 students in the State that will compete for top awards, scholarships, cash prizes, and the opportunity to progress to the International Science and Engineering Fair. The Florida State Science and Engineering Fair is the largest academic competition in the State of Florida. It provides over \$1,000,000 in cash and scholarships to the top students in the State; Madison will shine at this competition!
