Room 110B is the Place to be!

On Friday August 7, lethargic teens filed half-heartedly into the Seminole High shop building, room 110B. What they saw where neatly lined orange chairs and an uninviting linoleum floor. What they didn't know was that they would they were taking their first step into a world of flight, science, and endless possibilities which will be crowned by the reception of their Private Pilot License in their senior year after passing the Private Pilot Certification exam. For the next couple months, the students worked tirelessly to familiarize themselves with the basic workings of an airplane. Through interactive lessons, hand-drawn diagrams, and innovative classroom discussions they soon understood challenging flight concepts like the movement of air to generate lift, how to counter wind turbulence, stalling, and other airman knowledge principles.

The students enjoyed several visits from aviation professionals including:

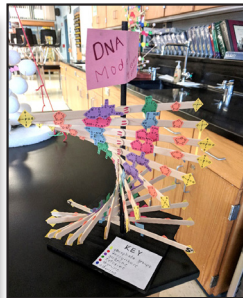
- NASA Engineer – Mr. Grimes

Who helped to introduce the students too some typically overlooked fields in the industry and share stories of their personal journeys from students to established professionals.

Later, ex-Airplane Mechanic, Marine, and class instructor Norman Johnson took his students to the Allegiant Maintenance Hangar, where they learned about basic airplane repairs.

In the following weeks they ventured out again, to the Aviation Career Expo at the Orlando-Sanford Int'l Airport. This included an aerobatics display show, Young Eagles plane rides, and a Global One 45-minute simulator demonstration ride.

Florida State Senator Rick Scott came to visit the students in the program and was more than impressed with their work and skillset. This meeting was followed by a visit from the New 6 team in which Mr. Johnson's 5th period class displayed their work on Model airplanes. Students where personally interviewed shared their newfound interested in planes, and the careers they could now envision in their future. Through his field experience, connections, and care for all his students, Norman Johnson has helped to wake once sleepy-eyed youth into the world's next generation of aviation professionals.



## From the Science Department

Students in IB Biology 1 and 2 created DNA models for their 3rd 9 weeks exam in which they illustrated both the individual molecular composition and the overall double helix. This enabled students to further understand how the molecular structure is vitally important to the DNA replication process. The models also look spectacular, too!

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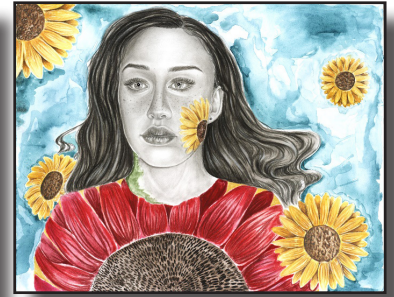

## Odyssey of the Mind

The 2019 Florida Odyssey of the Mind State Tournament was held on April 6th at the University of Central Florida, where two teams from our school competed in Problem 3 and Problem 4. We are so excited to say that both of our Seminole High School teams have advanced to World Finals!

Our problem 3 team, coached by Jenny Wadley, had to portray Leonardo Da Vinci's workplace in an original, creative performance that includes LDV, a patron, and a naysayer. The team recreated a DaVinci painting and made a three-dimensional representation of one of his works. They ended up winning first place in their division, out of sixteen teams, with a total raw score of 346 out of the maximum 350 points.

Our problem 4 team, coached by Beki Roberts, had to build a Balsawood structure, use a device to propel the structure in a carnival game and test the structure for strength in their own creative solution of games of skill and chance. The team's Balsawood structure weighed in at 565 pounds! They took second place out of the nine teams in their division, and are moving onto World Finals!

These two teams will be representing Seminole High School and the Florida Magic Center Region at World Finals, which is held at Michigan State University at the end of May. Be sure to cheer these teams on as they compete against teams from countries all over the world!

Mrs. Charlene Leiter, I salute you for being a "Hidden Hero" on our campus. Thank you for everything you do to make the lives of our students nutritionally better.



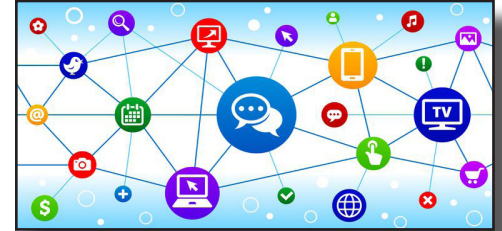

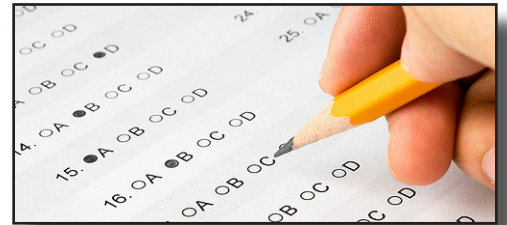
1. Photo ID. No ID = no entry

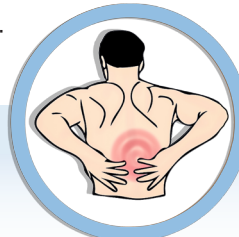
## Girls Basketball

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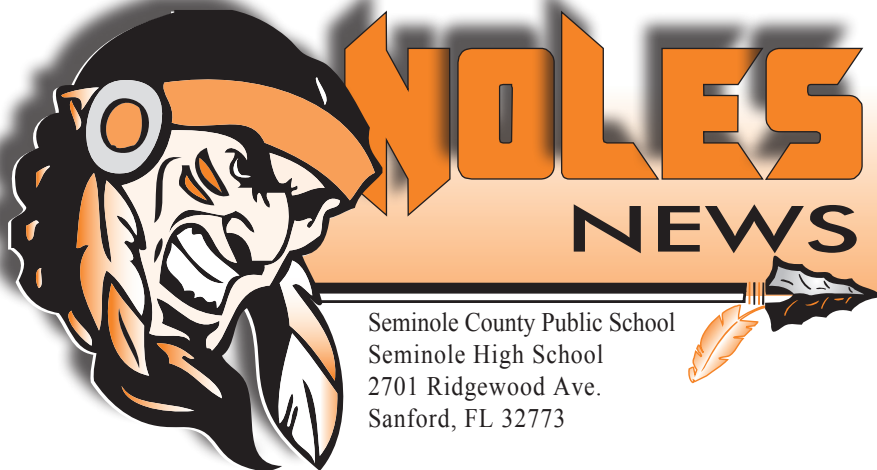
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## Remind

Do you want to stay informed? Get the latest information regarding student-specific events on Seminole High School's campus? Sign up for Remind! Past messages include changes to bell schedules, Media Center hours, tutoring opportunities, dress-up days for Homecoming, etc. For seniors, it included prom and graduation information. This texting service keeps your number private. Don't have a cell phone? You can sign up using your email. Or both!
