
It is my hope that the positive tide of momentum washing over our campus will be a catalyst in our school making our way back to an "A" rating.


also eliminates the risk of lost checks and cash, which often appear months too late at the bottom of the student's backpack. Yes, we've seen it happen.

PSAT/SAT School Day

On Wednesday, October 16th, all high school students in SCPS were expected to sit for the PSAT or SAT. Our 9th, 10th, and 11th graders took the PSAT, with our 12th graders taking the SAT. SCPS is a leader within the State of Florida as we commit the funds necessary to ensure all students can sit for these exams at no cost. PSAT / SAT School Day are valuable to our students for several reasons:

- There is no cost to students take the exams.
- Students can earn National Merit Scholar status with strong PSAT scores.
- For students who have not passed the Algebra I EOC, they can earn a concordant score with the PSAT. This means students can use their successful PSAT Math score to fulfill the graduation requirement that was not fulfilled with their previous Algebra I EOC score.
- Students can earn the SAT score necessary for college admission or earn an SAT score that helps them meet the qualification for various scholarships.
- The SAT can earn a student a concordant score to take the place of their nonpassing score on the Algebra I EOC or FSA English 10.

- November 13: Post-Secondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) for Juniors and Seniors who have not passed the Algebra 1 EOC
- December 3: Biology and US History EOC Retakes
- December 4 and 5: Algebra 1 EOC and Geometry EOC Retakes (2-day tests)
- December 16 through December 19: Nine Week Exams
- March 4: School Day SAT for Juniors








How Much Sleep Do Students Need?

Many U. S. students of all ages do not get enough sleep. About 85 percent of adolescents are reported to be mildly sleep deprived, and 10-40 percent may be significantly sleep deprived (Dahl & Lewin, 2002).

Several changes in adolescence contribute to sleep deprivation. First, adolescents wake up more easily during the night than younger children (Carskadon & Dement, 2000). Second, adolescents stay up late for sports, homework, and jobs. Third, adolescents easily shift to a "night-owl" pattern. From ages 3 to 17, children tend to get up at the same time, about 7 A.M., but adolescents stay up about two and one-half hours later than young children (Snell, Adam, & Duncan, 2007).



Adolescents often get less sleep on school nights and then sleep excessively on weekends (Ohayon, Carskadon, Guilleminault, & Vitiello, 2004). When they go to bed later on weekends than on school nights, they experience a "jetlag" effect each week, and their school achievement may suffer. Research has shown that high school students who earn As or Bs tend to have a small discrepancy between school-night and weekend bedtimes. In contrast, students with a discrepancy of two hours or more are likely to earn lower grades (Wolfson & Carskadon, 1998).

Given the evidence above, improving students' sleep should be of great concern to educators. Indeed, it may be among the lowest-cost approaches to improving student learning.





Know Where You Stand

Skyward is a great resource for monitoring grades and progress in class. But did you know that standardized testing scores can be found in Skyward too? Just simply click on the Test Scores button in the Navigation Menu in Skyward Student Access and Skyward Family Access to view your testing history. Many of these tests are graduation requirements in the State of Florida. Check on your test scores today to make sure you are meeting your requirements.
