From Your Palm Beach County Health District School Nurse:

Welcome back, students. I hope you've had a great start to the school year.

All students who need to take medication at school, whether daily or PRN meds, need to the provide the nurse's office with a completed medication form.

- (Palm Beach County authorization form) filled out by your doctor;
- A pharmacy label matching the orders from the doctor;
- A recent photo of the student.

For the protection of all students, no student is to bring any kind of medication to school without a doctor's authorization form. This includes over-the-counter medication. All medications are to be left in the clinic.

Please remember to wash your hands often. It's the single most effective way to prevent illness.

The most common complaints I see are headache and stomach ache, both of which can be avoided by getting plenty of sleep each night and eating a good breakfast each morning. It's been proven that children who don't eat breakfast don't do as well academically as those who do.

- 12. Your counselor is a resource for academic and personal concerns.
- 13. Accept the challenge offered by Seminole Ridge Community High School to 'SOAR' to your highest potential, and to grow both academically and personally.











