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4 Digital Safety Tips for Summer Break

Teach students to embrace summertime digital safety practices with the acronym **R.E.S.T**: As the school year comes to an end, students and staff are eagerly waiting for their first day of summer break. Thoughts of vacations to the beach or trips to see friends and family members can distract our minds from those last few days in the classroom. Although summer break can offer a time for relaxation and reflection, I believe that it can also be a vulnerable time for students engaged in the digital world. During the school year, students that experience cyberbullying or digital harassment can find support from their teachers, guidance counselors, and school administrators. But as our students embark on their summer vacations, it is important to remind them of a few digital safety tips for summer break. Help them remember by using the acronym **R.E.S.T**:

Remain cautious - It is important for students to review their privacy settings on social media sites like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, SnapChat, Skype, Kik, etc. Students should make sure that their social media profiles and posts don't reveal too much personal information, such as their full name, address, phone number, and location. Encourage students to share responsibly online.

Express positivity - Students who experience bullying or cyberbullying can exhibit symptoms of depression, anxiety, and loneliness. It is important for students to use social media to build each other up instead of cyberbullying. Sharing a positive comment often leads to others posting positively. Of course, if a student has nothing nice to post, then he or she shouldn't post it at all.

Stay active - Too much time in front of screens can lead to damage that includes eyestrain, attention problems, lack of sleep, and obesity. Encourage students to stay active throughout the summer months by joining a community sports team, going to the pool for a swim, or just being outside with friends.

Tell someone - If you have a student that has experienced cyberbullying throughout the school year, consider offering him or her your work email address in order to have someone to communicate with throughout the summer months. Although school is out, summer break can still be a time when students get support from their local school staff.

4 consejos de seguridad digital para las vacaciones de verano

Enseña a los estudiantes a adoptar prácticas de seguridad digital durante el verano con el acrónimo **R.E.S.T**: A medida que el año escolar llega a su fin, los estudiantes y el personal esperan ansiosamente su primer día de vacaciones de verano. Los pensamientos sobre vacaciones a la playa o viajes para ver a amigos y familiares pueden distraer nuestra mente de esos últimos días en el aula. Aunque las vacaciones de verano pueden ofrecer un momento de relajación y reflexión, creo que también pueden ser un momento vulnerable para los estudiantes involucrados en el mundo digital. Durante el año escolar, los estudiantes que sufren acoso cibernético o acoso digital pueden encontrar apoyo de sus maestros, orientadores y administradores escolares. Pero a medida que nuestros estudiantes se embarcan en sus vacaciones de verano, es importante recordarles algunos consejos de seguridad digital para las vacaciones de verano. Ayúdelos a recordar utilizando el acrónimo **R.E.S.T**:

Sea cauteloso: es importante que los estudiantes revisen su configuración de privacidad en sitios de redes sociales como Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, SnapChat, Skype, Kik, etc. Los estudiantes deben asegurarse de que sus perfiles y publicaciones en las redes sociales no revelen demasiada información personal, como su nombre completo, dirección, número de teléfono y ubicación. Anime a los estudiantes a compartir responsablemente en línea.

Expresar positividad: los estudiantes que sufren acoso o acoso cibernético pueden presentar síntomas de depresión, ansiedad y soledad. Es importante que los estudiantes utilicen las redes sociales para fortalecerse unos a otros en lugar del ciberacoso. Compartir un comentario positivo a menudo lleva a que otros publiquen de manera positiva. Por supuesto, si un estudiante no tiene nada bueno que publicar, entonces no debería publicarlo en absoluto.

Manténgase activo: Pasar demasiado tiempo frente a las pantallas puede provocar daños que incluyen fatiga visual, problemas de atención, falta de sueño y obesidad. Anime a los estudiantes a mantenerse activos durante los meses de verano uniéndose a un equipo deportivo comunitario, yendo a la piscina a nadar o simplemente saliendo al aire libre con amigos.

Cuéntaselo a alguien: si tienes un estudiante que ha sufrido acoso cibernético durante el año escolar, considera ofrecerle tu dirección de correo electrónico del trabajo para tener alguien con quien comunicarse durante los meses de verano. Aunque no haya clases, las vacaciones de verano aún pueden ser un momento en el que los estudiantes reciban apoyo del personal de su escuela local.

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BARR

I-Time is a weekly lesson that students participate in within their core classes. These lessons are used as a supplement to the school curriculum. Facilitated by the student's core-subject teachers, I-Time's collaboration focus helps students build strong relationships with teachers and each other—and practice essential life skills, such as communicating effectively and setting personal goals. I-Time also addresses important issues for adolescents, including grief and loss, appropriate use of technology, and handling difficult situations.

The BARR model has been proven to create statistically significant impacts in academic performance and outcomes for students, teachers, and schools, including especially powerful results narrowing gaps in student achievement.
