A PHONE CALL HOME MAKES ALL THE DIFFERENCE

You don't have to reserve phone calls to parents or guardians for bad news. Building relationships with parents can set you and your students on a path to success, and it can save time in the longer run.

CALLING PARENTS WITH CONCERNS AND ISSUES

As I made more calls throughout the year, I got better at putting parents at ease. Often they were a little nervous at the start of the conversation, and I found I got better results by focusing on collaboration rather than confrontation. How you open is important, so consider these steps for calling a student's home when you need to discuss a problem or concern.

- Introduce yourself by your first name. Sometimes we teachers address each other as Mr., Ms., or Mrs., but I suggest we approach parents or guardians as peers. When we use our first name, it lightens any tension—and there is often tension on that first call—and works to establish right away that we are collaborating in supporting their child.
- 2. Begin the conversation with a positive. This looks something like, "I'm Jessica's English teacher, and I'd like to start by saying I really appreciate her sense of humor. She gets us all laughing, and she is a reason period three is one of my favorite classes." By doing this, you convey to the parent or guardian that you see all aspects of who the child is, not just his or her challenges.
- 3. Describe only actions—avoid labeling. After setting a positive tone, move on to the issue. Avoid saying things like, "Jonathan is disrespectful," and instead try, "Jonathan often talks when I am talking or when classmates are sharing out, and when I ask him to please just listen, he often continues talking." Stay away from words like defiant, rude, hyperactive, etc. Describing a child's actions is simply providing data; this establishes you not as judge but rather as an observer. Then share the consequences or steps you've already taken following the child's actions.
- 4. Ask questions seeking support. Once you've described the child's actions and the consequences, what happens next is crucial—asking parents or guardians for their support and advice. This creates the "we" connection you want and need with parents. For example, "What are some ideas you might have to help me support Jonathan and get him back on track?" or "What might be a suggestion for

UNA LLAMADA TELEFÓNICA A CASA MARCA LA DIFERENCIA

No tiene que reservar llamadas telefónicas a los padres o tutores para recibir malas noticias. Establecer relaciones con los padres puede ponerlo a usted y a sus estudiantes en el camino hacia el éxito, y puede ahorrar tiempo a largo plazo.

LLAMAR A LOS PADRES CON INQUIETUDES Y PROBLEMAS

A medida que hacía más llamadas a lo largo del año, mejoraba en tranquilizar a los padres. A menudo estaban un poco nerviosos al comienzo de la conversación, y descubrí que obtenía mejores resultados al centrarme en la colaboración en lugar de la confrontación. La forma en que abres es importante, así que ten en cuenta estos pasos para llamar a la casa de un estudiante cuando necesites hablar de un problema o inquietud.

- Preséntate por tu nombre de pila. A veces los maestros nos dirigimos unos a otros como Sr., Sra. o Sra., pero sugiero que nos acerquemos a los padres o tutores como compañeros. Cuando usamos nuestro nombre de pila, aligeramos cualquier tensión, y a menudo hay tensión en esa primera llamada, y funciona para establecer de inmediato que estamos colaborando para apoyar a su hijo.
- 2. Comienza la conversación con un mensaje positivo. Esto se ve algo así como: "Soy la maestra de inglés de Jessica y me gustaría comenzar diciendo que realmente aprecio su sentido del humor. Nos hace reír a todos, y es una de las razones por las que el tercer período es una de mis clases favoritas". Al hacer esto, le transmites al padre o tutor que ves todos los aspectos de quién es el niño, no solo sus desafíos.
- 3. Describa solo las acciones, evite el etiquetado. Después de establecer un tono positivo, pasa al tema. Evita decir cosas como "Jonathan es irrespetuoso" y, en su lugar, intenta decir "Jonathan a menudo habla cuando yo hablo o cuando los compañeros de clase están compartiendo, y cuando le pido que por favor escuche, a menudo continúa hablando". Aléjate de palabras como desafiante, grosero, hiperactivo, etc. Describir las acciones de un niño es simplemente proporcionar datos; esto te establece no como juez sino como observador. Luego, comparta las consecuencias o los pasos que ya ha tomado después de las acciones del niño.
- 4. Haga preguntas en busca de apoyo. Una vez que haya descrito las acciones del niño y las consecuencias, lo que sucede a continuación es crucial: pedir a los padres o tutores su apoyo y consejo. Esto crea la conexión de "nosotros"

talking with him? What works best with him?'

CALLING WITH GOOD NEWS

Phone calls home need not be reserved for problems. Strongly consider calling the homes of students who have improved their efforts or class grade, been helpful to their classmates or to you, or contributed routinely to class discussions, for example. Students talk to each other about their teachers (like it or not), and a positive phone call home will not only give you props with kids but contribute to building trust, rapport, and community. And these calls are great morale boosters for you after you make the difficult calls.

SENDING TEXTS & EMAILS

For positive comments and good news, text messages and emails are great. For concerns and problems, phone calls or meetings are the wisest routes. As we all know, texts and emails can be misconstrued. Talking with parents or guardians in real time avoids any of those digital message mishaps and, more importantly, allows you to immediately answer questions, clarify any concerns, and construct next steps together.

LLAMANDO CON BUENAS NOTICIAS

Las llamadas telefónicas a casa no tienen por qué reservarse para problemas. Considere seriamente llamar a las casas de los estudiantes que han mejorado sus esfuerzos o su calificación en clase, que han sido útiles para sus compañeros de clase o para usted, o que han contribuido rutinariamente a las discusiones en clase, por ejemplo. Los estudiantes hablan entre sí sobre sus maestros (les guste o no), y una llamada telefónica positiva a casa no solo le dará apoyo con los niños, sino que contribuirá a generar confianza, relación y comunidad. Y estas llamadas son un gran refuerzo de moral para ti después de tomar las decisiones difíciles.

ENVÍO DE MENSAJES DE TEXTO Y CORREOS ELECTRÓNICOS

Para comentarios positivos y buenas noticias, los mensajes de texto y los correos electrónicos son geniales. Para inquietudes y problemas, las llamadas telefónicas o las reuniones son las rutas más sabias. Como todos sabemos, los mensajes de texto y los correos electrónicos pueden malinterpretarse. Hablar con los padres o tutores en tiempo real evita cualquiera de esos percances con los mensajes digitales y, lo que es más importante, le permite responder preguntas de inmediato, aclarar cualquier inquietud y construir juntos los próximos pasos.






