MCKAY SCHOLARSHIP

February 8, 2021

Required notification to parents/guardians of students with disabilities:

Your child **may** be eligible to participate in the John M. McKay Scholarship for Students with Disabilities Program for the 2020-21 school year.

In order to be eligible for the McKay Scholarship Program, a student must apply for the program prior to withdrawing from public school. The student must have an Individual Education Plan (IEP), or 504 Accommodation Plan issued under s. 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (with duration of more than six months), and:

- Have been enrolled and reported for funding in a Florida public school (Grades K-12) for the school
 year prior to applying for a scholarship (foster student may be exempt from the requirement); or
- Have been a prekindergarten student who was enrolled and reported for funding in a Florida public school during the school year prior to applying for a scholarship; or
- Have received specialized instructional services under the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program
 from an approved provider pursuant to section 1002.66, Florida Statutes, during the previous school year; or
- Have attended the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind during the preceding school year's student membership surveys (Grades K-12).

If your child meets these requirements you may receive a scholarship for your child to attend a participating private school. Parents may also choose another public school within the district's school choice plan or another public school in an adjacent school district. In order for a student to be eligible for the program, an intent to participate in the McKay Scholarship Program must be filed on the Department of Education's School Choice website (www.floridaschoolchoice.org) prior to withdrawing from public school. The deadline to apply for the first payment period for private school McKay for the 2020-21 school year is July 3, 2021. Parents interested in public school choice McKay need to call the district McKay contact at 352-253-6600.

This notice does not guarantee your student's eligibility. BEHIND THE WHEEL

If your HS student has their driver's permit, they need to take advantage of **Behind the Wheel**. It is a course that is taught all year long **and** during the summer. Classes run from 3 to 6 on Mon, Tues, Thurs, and Fri for 7 days in a row. New classes start every two weeks.

- Students get 10 hours of actual drive time with a certified instructor.
- 2. Most auto insurance companies offer a discount for having taken the course.

- 4. It is totally FREE to all Lake county residents (even virtual and home-schooled students are welcome to take the course)

The South Lake Sr. FFA chapter won the state championship in the Farm Business Management Contest. They will compete for national recognition in an FFA Career Development Event at the 94th National FFA Convention & Expo. in Indianapolis next Fall. The team won the contest on Thursday December 3rdth in competition against teams from FFA chapters across the state of Florida. Team members include Hailey Bladek, Madison Gallady, Abby Kruse and Hector Rangel. Rangel had the second highest individual score in the state. The team is coached by agriculture teacher Jeremy Odom. Odom said that the team was very consistent in their scoring with all four individuals working hard to win the state competition. He credits the math teachers at South High School for providing a strong mathematical background for the students to be able to prepare to complete the problem solving problems that are used to help make managerial decisions in the agricultural industry. The team will now raise money to finance their trip to the National Competition.

Farm business management is one of 24 National FFA CDE areas, covering job skills in everything from communications to mechanics. Participants are given a business problem to solve and take a written test on business principles. During this activity, the team is judged on their use of business management and economic principles, analysis of farm records and management resources and consideration given to risk management practices. This event enables members to apply the skills they have learned in challenging real-life situations. CDEs help students develop the abilities to think critically, communicate clearly and perform effectively in a competitive job market.

Thanks to all who hosted these events and gave our art students the chance to show their art.
























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ATTENTION PARENTS

Dear Parents:

Please be aware of the attendance policy set by the Lake County School Board. Here are a few of the attendance concerns that we come across most often. Please feel free to review the Attendance Policy in the Lake County School Website, Code of Conduct for more information.

- · Only 2 "parent notes" will be excused per 9 week period.
- Documentation explaining absence needs to be turned in within 2 school days after the return of the student.
- · 3 tardies per 9 weeks = 1 excused absence.
- If more than 15 minutes tardy to class will constitute an absence in that class for that day.

You are not able to check out your students the last 20 minutes of school. Please check them out before then if the need arises for you to pick up your student for any reason.

It is <u>very important</u> that you let our school nurse know if your child has a medical concern. For example: If your child has Diabetes, Asthma, Allergies, etc., a folder will be created in the clinic for them with the medical concern. This information is critical so that in the event that an issue arises with your child while in school, we will know how to respond and help your child, without wasting precious time trying to figure out what is wrong.


