### Language Arts

### Sixth Grade

Sixth grade language arts students have been working hard to analyze multiple aspects of informational and literary texts, such as author's point of view, text structure, and word choice. Some of the texts we have analyzed together include, "Jabberwocky" from Lewis Carroll's sequel to *Alice in Wonderland*, and the article "Dog's Process Language the Same Way Humans Do." Ask your student what they found most interesting about each of the texts we have read. This quarter, we will begin to focus more heavily on our writing skills to prepare for the FSA Writing Exam in March.

### Seventh Grade

In 7th Grade Language Arts students will be working towards writing argumentative essays. First they will practice understanding the author's point of view. Next they will learn to evaluate an author's argument to determine whether or not it contains relevant and sufficient evidence to support a claim. Finally they will begin writing argumentative essays of their own. When we are finished with writing, students will review literary standards from quarter two as they prepare for the upcoming state testing. Encourage students to put forth their best effort into classwork as well as getting assignments turned in on time. Canvas and Skyward will be the best way to keep track of due dates, grades and attendance this school year.



### Eighth Grade

During Quarter 2, eighth grade Language Arts students practiced their essay-writing skills by analyzing three informational texts and then writing an explanatory or argumentative essay regarding the topic. In addition to writing, students close-read a variety of texts to: determine author's purpose and point of view; determine connections and distinctions between ideas; and determine the effect of specific word choice on tone and meaning. A mid-year assessment through the iReady platform was administered in December to track students' progress with reading standards. As Quarter 3 begins, students will be refining their essaywriting skills in preparation for the FSA Writing exam. They will also continue to analyze both informational and literary texts to master standards related to the following: word impact, structure, and point of view.



### Math

### Sixth Grade Math

For third quarter, sixth grade math students will be studying coordinate planes and solving onestep equations and inequalities.

### Seventh Grade Math

In seventh grade math, students are studying two and three dimensional geometry, surface area, and volume.

### **Honors Geometry**

In Geometry Honors, students have been studying triangles, including congruence, similarity, relationships, and right triangle trigonometry. In the third quarter we will delve into quadrilaterals, perimeter and area, and circle geometry.

The online textbook, which is located through the PearsonEasy Bridge app on the students' launch pad, has a great Student Resources section which includes Homework Video Tutors.

### **Eighth Grade Pre-Algebra**

In 8th grade Pre-Algebra students have been working hard and will continue to do so. We started our flight of the 2nd semester learning about Integer exponents and roots. We ended that journey and took another flight to the world famous Pythagorean Theorem where we are learning to use our legs to find the hypotenuse. We will then take off again in February with the next stop at transformation. Here we will learn about reflection, translation and rotation.

### Honors Algebra I

In Honors Algebra I, students are currently covering Solving and Graphing Quadratics Functions. Next, we will learn about 1 and 2 variable statistics.

### **Science**

### Science is always up to something new!

### Sixth Grade Life Science

Students in Sixth Grade Life Science have finished scientific classification and are beginning cellular reproduction, including mitosis, meiosis, and cancer. Our biology studies will then continue with heredity and genetics.

### Sixth Grade Comprehensive Science

In Sixth Grade Comprehensive Science students are finishing the earth science portion of our curriculum with the water cycle, ocean currents, and severe weather. We will then begin biology, including cells and the human body.

### Seventh Grade Comprehensive Science

In Seventh Grade Comprehensive Science students have completed the section on Earth science and will begin learning about Life Science. Throughout the 3rd quarter we will be discussing cell reproduction including mitosis and meiosis, genetics and ecology. We will build upon topics covered in 6th grade through engaging lessons and activities.

## **Seventh Grade Honors Earth / Space Science**

In Seventh Grade Honors Earth/Space Science the students completed the first semester with a focus on space and are now



working on the Earth! We are covering the Earth and its interior layers, plate tectonics, earthquakes and volcanoes. We will be covering the processes that influence the surface of the Earth as well. After that we go back to the past, looking at geologic time.

### **Eighth Grade Comprehensive Science**

Students in Eighth Grade Comprehensive Science are progressing through their introduction to chemistry unit as they prepare for the SSA May 6th. This state assessment will cover three years of content so we have a lot to review!

While this has been a much different year than the past we are all happy to see so much success and hope it continues into our testing season. Stay strong and stay safe Sea lions!

### STEM

In 6th Grade STEM students are starting their Medical Detectives Unit in which they learn about the human body, specifically the Nervous System. After acquiring the basic knowledge they will diagnose illness and solve medical mysteries.

In 7th Grade STEM students are starting Flight and Space where they will learn the mechanics of flight and space living.

In 8th Grade STEM the Face to Face students will be using their knowledge of Mechanical Gears and Programming to complete tasks such as creating Traffic Lights, Elevators, Toll Booths and much more. LaunchEd will dive into the realm of Electronics. Starting with what is an atom, how electricity travels, and how circuits are made.

### **Digital Information Technology**

In the very near future 7th grade students will need to have an idea of what they will take for their 8th grade school year of 2021-22. When making selections your student may sign up for the **DIT** (**Digital Information Technology course #8207310**) **computer high school course.** The course is designed to give a basic overview of current business computer information systems and trends. The emphasis is placed on developing fundamental *computer skills of Microsoft Office*. Students passing this *prerequisite course* with a passing grade will



receive **high school credit**. Please take this opportunity and have your student **sign up for the DIT high school computer course** to get ahead. DIT is rigorous. It is necessary for the student to have basic computer skills, be hardworking, determined and very reliable. ### Art

Art 1 and 2 have been steadily creating this year! Art 1 has focused on the ELEMENTS OF ART/ DESIGN; line, texture, value, color, shape, value, and form and well as touching on the PRINCIPLES OF ART/ DESIGN as well. Art 2 has continued to explore these while diving deeper into observational drawing and observing some contemporary artists.




