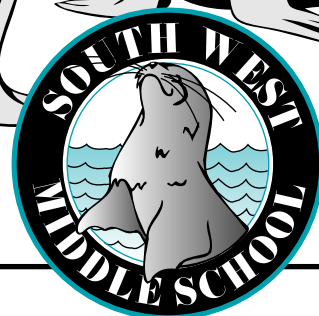

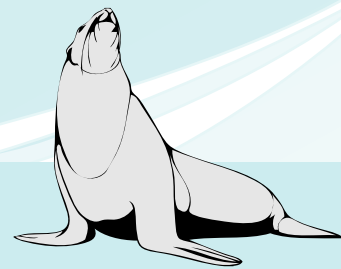
Florida student council members and hope we can make this a great event for everyone attending.

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Curriculum News

Language Arts

Seventh Grade

During Quarter 1, 7th-grade began the memoir *Red Scarf Girl* by Ji-li Jiang. Students enjoyed learning about the cultural revolution in China during the 1960s through the eyes of a 13-year-old girl. In Quarter 2 students are reading the infamous Broadway show, *A Raisin in the Sun*, showcasing the struggles of a black family in Chicago during the 1950s. Throughout Quarter 1 and continuing into the second, 7th graders have been working hard to learn vocabulary word parts every week. Remember to complete and study your digital notebook weekly to be prepared for a quiz every Friday!

Eighth Grade

Throughout Quarter 1, 8th-grade students have been working hard as they adjust to our new digital textbook, Amplify. Located in LaunchPad, the Amplify app allows students to read, write, listen, and respond to curriculum aligned to our new B.E.S.T. standards (Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking). They are finishing up their first unit with our new standards. They have been focusing on analyzing narratives and writing narratives. Students are enjoying the creativity that comes along with narrative writing.

As we move forward into Unit 2, students will focus on the writings of both famous and lesser-known Americans who were critically, intellectually, and physically engaged in that debate during the Civil War time period. The lessons allow students to dive into these important texts, with a clear focus on how each writer reflects on this question and give them many opportunities to reflect on, discuss, write about, and debate ideas of equality, opportunity, justice, and freedom.

Mathematics

Algebra 1 Honors

Students in Algebra 1 Honors have been working on linear functions. Students recently took the district Progress Monitoring STAR Assessment. Once Performance Bands are set by the district, we will be able to share data with parents and students.

Science

Sixth Grade

Comprehensive Science

6th-grade Comprehensive Science 1 is moving along extraordinarily this year. We have studied units on Energy, Gravity, and Motion. 6th-grade scientists have examined how scientists observe, infer, and analyze things in the universe. Scientists study data, form conclusions, and produce scientific theories and laws. During the second 9 weeks, we will focus on Earth Science, including weather and climate, erosion, and the Earth's Structure.

Life Science

During the first 9 weeks, our Life Science students explored the nature of science as well. We have also utilized scientific laws and theories to investigate scientific theories. Students are now exploring the Theory of Evolution, fossil evidence, and natural selection. In addition, we are also addressing Ecology, the study of the relationships between living organisms, including humans, and their physical environment; it strives to understand the essential connections between plants and animals and the world around them. We are beginning our investigations of cells, which will carry through to the end of the second 9 weeks.

Seventh Grade

Comprehensive Science

In 7th-grade Comprehensive Science 2, we concluded our units on Energy Transfer and Waves. Throughout Quarter 1, students completed various labs, activities, and projects that reinforced their understanding of Physical Science. During Quarter 2, we will focus on Earth Science, which introduces topics such as Geologic Time and Geologic Processes. We look forward to a great second quarter and encourage students to continue monitoring their grades/assignments on Canvas throughout the year!

Eighth Grade

Comprehensive Science

What a first 9 weeks it has been for our 8th-grade scientists! We have explored many light years beyond Earth exploring new galaxies in the universe. The second 9 weeks will be much closer to home, however, as we remain in our Solar System, discussing the key players in space affecting our everyday life. While we stay in space for a large part of the year we will hop into our introduction of chemistry soon before beginning our SSA review, spiraling back to 6th and 7th-grade content.

Physical Science Honors

Physical Science Honors is off to a great start. After applying Isaac Newton's Laws to Motion, Work, and Power in the first quarter we are ready to tackle a very challenging second quarter. Mr. Jn-Baptiste loves using hands-on activities to explore new content with his Honors classes! We will continue to discuss Energy but will also cover Electricity and Thermodynamics before our midterm. In addition to this high school content, we will also continue our spiral review of 6–8th-grade science content to ensure success on the Statewide Science Assessment (SSA) this spring.

Social Studies

Sixth Grade

World History

6th Grade World History students are wrapping up Unit 4: Mesopotamia and beginning to learn about Ancient Egyptians in Unit 5. They'll compare and contrast Egypt with Mesopotamia and learn about how different civilizations have different customs, but typically have a fairly similar structure.

Seventh Grade

Civics

7th Grade Civics students are beginning Unit 5 which analyzes the writing of the United States Constitution and the debates and compromises that went into its conception. They will then analyze the structure and how the founding fathers' included the philosophical belief systems of Montesquieu and John Locke, limiting the government while also giving it enough power to function.

Eighth Grade

U.S. History

8th Grade U.S. History students are finishing Unit 3 on the growth of the colonies. Unit 4 examines how imperialism and mercantilism by European nations led to the French & Indian War and the impact the war had on Native American populations.



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Electives

Drama

STEM

In 6th grade STEM, we have covered topics such as technology, engineering, and chemistry. Students have participated in multiple exciting labs such as creating glue and making ice cream! In Quarter 2, we will be focusing on projects/labs that focus on the introduction of nanotechnology, simple machines, and physics. We are looking forward to an exciting 2nd quarter and want to remind students to monitor their grades/assignments on Canvas every day!



Digital Information Technology

Our high school computer class, DIT, is off to a great start. We started Quarter 1 reviewing hardware and software. We also completed the introduction to programming using HTML. Currently, we are on the fun subject of social media, such as Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, and Snapchat. We have discussed the precautions for protecting our identity online. We look for to a very successful second 9 weeks.



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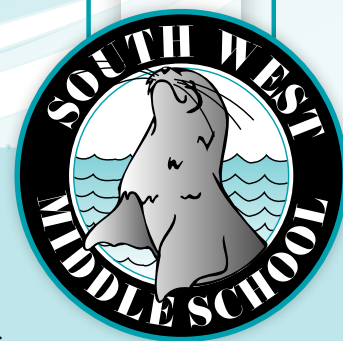
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Information & Communication Technology 1

In ICT1, we have covered topics such as Computer Components and Operating Systems. We were able to take apart a computer and put our hands on the equipment that makes it work. 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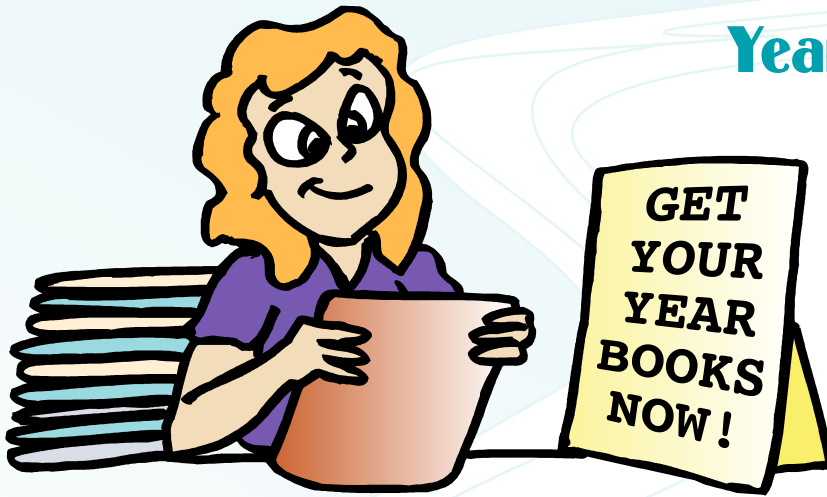
