MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL SPARGER

During the third nine weeks we had much to celebrate. Our **chorus, band, jazz band, orchestra** and **dance teams** competed in their **performance assessments**. Superior and excellent ratings were awarded to these outstanding groups. Our band was selected to perform at the **National Concert Band Festival** in Indiana. Only **two bands from Florida** and **twenty-two from the Nation** were selected to perform. The drama department had a very successful run of the **musical** "**Frozen**." Three seniors earned a **Congressional nomination to a Military Academy**. Twenty-one seniors signed a letter of intent to continue to play their **sport at college**. Lastly, thank you also to the SGA for continuing the tradition of placing a **Valentine's card on each student's locker**.

For most students, the final quarter of the school year will be the most crucial as students must complete the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST), End of Course Exams (EOC), Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) exams, and semester final exams. 

It's been a very busy past few months for the Hawk Battalion. Congratulations to our Hawk Precision Drill and Color Guard Teams as they competed in a local (area 4) Drill and Ceremonies Competition at East River High School. Entering three teams, the Hawk Battalion placed first in all three events. Our three competitive teams are the Unarmed Platoon Regulation 13 Cadets executing a specified scripted drill sequence, commanded by Cadet LTC Preston Bates. Our two Color Guard Teams,



(Male and Female) also took first place honors for their events. Each four-man team consists of two Color Bearers and two Rifle Bearers. Color Guard teams also execute a specified scripted sequence. This train-up allowed near perfection as our three teams competed in the Area 4 (district/regional) State Qualifier at Umatilla High School.
