I hope this letter finds you healthy and **happy and enjoying the New Year**. In some ways, this year looks much different than others, but in other ways it has followed a similar pattern. We want to commend all those on campus who are consistent with following CDC guidelines and allowing this school year to take place. A special thank you to those faculty, staff and administration that have embraced the role of "essential worker" and put the school's needs ahead of their own.

Despite all of this, as strange as it may sound, we are already thinking about next school year. Over the next several weeks, students will meet with their school counselor to begin the process of **selecting classes for next school year**. These meetings will take place during the school day during the month of **February**. Please reach out to your student's high school counselor with questions on the registration process. For our seniors, they will begin to finalize their plans for life after high school. All seniors are encouraged to stay current with **graduation dates** and **deadlines** and to look for the next edition of the senior letter. We anxiously await celebrating with the **Class of 2021** at their graduation ceremony on **Saturday**, **June 5 at 12:30 pm**.

All students in grades **9 and 10** are scheduled to take the **Florida Standards Assessment** (FSA) / **English Language Arts** (ELA) exam during the second semester. The **FSA Writing** will be administered on **April 5 and 6** followed by the **FSA Reading** from **May 3 – 6**. The required **End of Course** (EOC) tests for students currently enrolled in **Algebra**, **Biology**, **Geometry**, and **United States Histor**y is scheduled to take place beginning the week of **May 3rd**. For students enrolled in **AP** and **IB classes**, those exams are scheduled to be administered during the **month of May**.

As a result of the collective efforts of our students, faculty and community, the Hawks continue to

soar. Our graduation rate rose to above 94% and over 1,800 of our students earned honor roll status for the first semester. Nearly 250 students earned straight "A" grades for the first semester and many of our fall and winter sport student-athletes placed on the all-area team for their sport. Conference, district, and regional championships were also won by both teams and individuals. *It's truly a great time to be a Hawk!*

German Club


Hallo Leute!

We hope everyone enjoyed their holiday break and returned ready to soar through the final semester. Seniors going to college that have not already completed the FAFSA for



federal financial aid online at www.fafsa.ed.gov need to do so immediately. Also, if you did not register for the Bright Futures Scholarship, which is state financial aid, please see Mr. Schaffer in the Guidance office right away for information on how to apply. Class of 2021 students also need to stop by the Activities Office to pick up your Senior letter from Mrs. Rocco, which contains dates and details for upcoming events. Check our school website, <u>www.sprucecreekhigh.com</u>, for an updated list of available scholarships as well.

Juniors and Seniors that have taken Algebra 2 or higher should register for the SAT and/or ACT for college acceptance and to meet testing requirements for a Bright Futures Scholarship. If you qualify for free/reduced student lunch, see Mr. Schaffer in Guidance for a fee waiver. The SAT and ACT can also be used to earn concordant scores to meet high school graduation requirements if you have not already passed the FSA ELA and/or Algebra 1 EOC.

Please listen to daily announcements and visit our school website often. You can email Mrs. Rocco (<u>rrrocco@volusia.k12.fl.us</u>) and ask for her to add your email address to the daily announcements distribution list so you don't miss news. The announcements will be delivered to your inbox daily!

Registration for next school year is scheduled to begin soon. The Counselors are looking forward to meeting individually with students to review recommendations and elective choices and to request courses for next school year. Remember foreign language is NOT a graduation requirement, but it IS required for university admission and for Bright Future Scholarships. If you need to remediate any courses you did not pass, talk to your Counselor about summer opportunities to get caught up with your credits!

Advance Registration for currently dual enrolled students begins March 29th at DSC. For all others, Open Registration begins April 1st. After registering, remember to bring your DSC schedule to your Counselor. If you have questions or are interested in starting dual enrollment, please visit the Guidance Office before/after school or during your lunch.

Please remember that students may see their Counselor without an appointment before/after school or during student lunch. Despite the challenges presented by COVID-19 this year, we have managed to provide a plethora of service activities available for our NHS members both online and live students. We have completed over 1,500 service hours collectively as a club for the second quarter with about ten community service opportunities! Our general club-wide Microsoft Team meetings were held after school on November 18, December 16, and we will have our last one for the second quarter on January 20.

During this time, the first NHS District meeting was also held virtually on November 7th run by our district president Meryl Liu and had an abundant amount of student participants. We were able to incorporate the yearly creation of Plarn (plastic yarn), yet again, and even created face masks out of clean socks. We also wrote appreciation cards for our first responders.

From October 26th-November 20th we were also able to hold two extremely successful drives: the annual Thanksgiving Food Drive and the new Cleaning Supplies Drive. The Thanksgiving Food Drive was started with the goal to obtain three boxes of canned goods to provide a Thanksgiving dinner to students' families in need at Creek. We were able to surpass this goal by creating an incredible 13 boxes, fully packed with food for multiple nights, which we provided to students as well as two teachers whose families were impacted by COVID. The rest of the canned goods we received we were able to donate to our school food pantry. For the cleaning supplies drive, we were able to provide over 20 boxes full of goodies to Campbell Elementary in order to help the staff currently struggling to provide a safe environment for their students. Seeing the success and bright faces from all of the recipients made these drives more than a quantifiable success and will surely occur next year as well.

One of the new opportunities we were able to offer this year was actually run by two of our new members, Miriam Girgis and Aleena Rahman who created Hope in an Envelope. By creating and decorating cards, students were able to convey their gratitude and thankfulness to nurses as well as provide a feeling of hope to families in the hospital during the Holidays. This opportunity was available in the month of November and December, providing a wonderful opportunity to spread holiday cheer.

We then continued this safe way to convey our thanks by making cards for our own teachers and staff at Creek by creating holiday-themed cards. Both drives, yet again, resulted in an overwhelming amount of support by the incredible NHS members.

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All About AVID

AVID is a four-year elective class for students who are serious about succeeding in high school and college. Our goal is to provide capable students with the support to thrive in any curriculum and course they desire to take through developing and practicing useful academic skills. The class is composed of classwork led by the AVID teacher and tutorial groups led by high school tutors. AVID methodologies focus on WICOR strategies:

- Writing practice writing conceptual questions, reflections, reports and essays Inquiry use Socratic questioning to help students develop independent thinking that apply directly to their studies
- Collaboration work together with others to brainstorm and develop strategies and ideas around subject-specific tutorials twice a week
- **Organization** learn to organize your binder, notes, agendas, study schedule, etc.; then carry these techniques into your home life to become a better student who is always prepared
- **Reading** understand and analyze a variety of texts Several benefits await prospective AVID students. AVID is a "class community" composed of peers, teachers and tutors geared towards encouraging academic and personal success.

We have created a supportive community environment to allow a consistent source of support for all four years of high school with the same AVID teacher. AVID teachers coach students through high school course selection, high stakes test preparation, and college applications. You may be well-suited for AVID if this list describes you: You work well with others. You have a positive attitude in school. You do your homework. You want to challenge yourself. You are willing to try different methods for learning and keeping track of assignments. You want to understand class material (math, English, science, history, etc) more thoroughly You may not have support at home for academic and college planning. You would earn better grades with more support in learning methods and organization. You would enjoy being a part of a mini-community in high school. If so, this class may be for you! Who is not well-suited for AVID? This class is not for you if you prefer to work alone, don't plan to go to a 4-year college or have a career in mind, don't take learning seriously, or repeatedly miss class assignments. This is not a course for remedial or at-risk students; it is not intended to be a last resort for students who are failing courses. Students will be selected based on their aptitude for the program, determined through an application as well as an interview. January 5,2021 Graduation Fee– Paid by all seniors- You may pay online with a credit card or debit card or with cash or check or card to the Student Activity's office. Make checks payable to Spruce Creek High School. Graduation fees are \$80.00.

If you have a cap and gown from a sibling who graduated from Spruce Creek less than six years ago or if you do not plan to participate/walk with the Class of 2021. Your graduation expenses are \$50.00. Contact Mrs. Rocco regarding the reduced fee.

February 2-11, 2021 Grad Bash Tickets on Sale - See Mrs. Rocco in the Activities Office before or after school or during lunch to purchase your Grad Bash Ticket. Tickets will only be sold on these four days, or until they are sold out. The cost is \$120 and includes admission and charter bus transportation. Grad Bash Night is April 30, 2021. Ticket purchases will be refunded in the event Grad Bash is cancelled.

April 5, 2021 Senior Speaker try-outs – Sign up in advance in the Activities Office. For the audition, prepare a two-minute speech to present to a committee at commencement ceremony. Tryouts are based on verbal presentation and speech content. One senior will be selected to read their speech at graduation.

April 13-15, 2021 Cap & Gown Delivery Days – Caps & gowns will be distributed to those who have paid their Graduation fee. Announcements and other graduation supplies ordered will be distributed at this time by Jostens.

April 19, 2021 Purchase Graduation Tickets and Parking Passes – Prices TBA – Every guest attending our Graduation ceremony must have a ticket to enter the Ocean Center. The number of tickets to be sold will be determined in April.

April 24, 2021 Prom – Daytona 500 Club, 7PM – 11pm. To purchase a ticket, all obligations must be paid, and detentions served. This event is tentative until cleared by CDC guidelines.

April 30, 2021 Grad Bash - At Universal Studios / Islands of Adventure from 7pm – 2am (Buses leave at 5:00pm) Tickets are only sold for this in February. This event is tentative until cleared by CDC guidelines.

June 5, 2021 Graduation Ceremony – Ocean Center, Daytona Beach at 12:30pm

Seniors should report to their assigned area at the Ocean Center by 11:30am dressed in cap and gown, to line up for the processional. The graduation ceremony will last approximately 90 minutes.

GRADUATION ATTIRE

ALL GRADUATES should remember that hair styles are to be kept simple so that graduation caps will fit on the head properly. Caps are worn level on the head, not at an angle. ONLY CORDS, PINS AND MEDALLIONS DISTIBUTED BY SPRUCE CREEK HIGH SCHOOL MAY BE WORN WITH GOWNS. YOU MAY NOT DECORATE YOUR CAP.

YOUNG LADIES: Wear a cool, comfortable dress under the gown; choose a style with a simple neckline which will not interfere with the neckline of the graduation gown. Dresses should not hang below the graduation gown. Black shoes only, preferably with medium height heels. Heels and wedges must be black. No dangling earrings.

YOUNG MEN: Wear black color dress pants and black dress shoes and socks. NO jeans, sneakers, deck shoes or flip flops permitted. Wear a white dress shirt with a black tie / bow tie.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ATTENDING GRADUATION : Each ticket holder, including children, may carry an approved clear bag and a clutch purse: One clear bag no larger than 12"x 6"x 12" or a one-gallon clear Ziploc, or similar bag. One small clutch bag or purse no larger than 6.5"x 6.5", with or without a strap. -Diapers and wipes may be carried in a clear bag; however, diaper bags are not permitted. -Additional clothing, blankets, etc. are permitted if carried loosely (preferably over the shoulder to be screened more quickly) or in an approved clear bag. Small cameras, binoculars and cell phones may be carried loosely or in an approved clear bag.

Parking for graduation is available at the Ocean Center and surrounding parking lots. Guests will pay \$5.00 to park. Carpooling is HIGHLY recommended. All seniors and guests are asked to plan accordingly so that you arrive on time for Graduation. Doors will close at 12:15pm and guests will not be admitted until after the graduates have entered the Ocean Center and the ceremony has begun.
